Kurangkan stigma, diskriminasi terhadap penghidap HIV, AIDS

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SEBUT sahaja penyakit HIV atau AIDS, pasti ramai yang gerun. Tidak kurang juga yang mula menunjukkan reaksi negatif kerana penyakit ini sering kali dikaitkan dengan aktiviti tidak bermoral seperti penyalahgunaan dadah, seks bebas dan sebagainya.

Namun, tugas menghukum bukan terletak di tangan anggota masyarakat.

Sebaliknya, mereka ini perlu diberi sokongan untuk menerima rawatan kerana ia bukan sahaja melibatkan diri mereka sendiri malah keluarga mereka.

Pensyarah Pusat Kajian Psikologi dan Kesejahteraan Manusia (Psitra), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Dr. Azahah Abu Hassan Shaari berkata, perbincangan isu ini boleh dianggap kritikal kerana stigma negatif dan diskriminasi hanya akan memburukkan keadaan pesakit dan keluarga.

Negativiti yang diterima akan menyebabkan mereka ini mengelak untuk menjalani ujian saringan serta mendapatkan rawatan.

"Advokasi kesedaran dan pemerkasaan HIV dan AIDS di Malaysia adalah satu isu yang kritikal disebabkan oleh pelbagai faktor termasuk kurangnya pengetahuan yang tepat mengenai jangkitan dan kaedah pencegahan dalam

kalangan masyarakat.

"Stigma dan diskriminasi berkaitan HIV dan AIDS akan menghalang individu daripada menjalani ujian saringan, mendapatkan rawatan, serta perkhidmatan sokongan," katanya kepada *Utusan Malaysia*.

Justeru, UKM melalui Psitra menjalinkan kerjasama dengan Persatuan Kesejahteraan Rakyat Malaysia (PKRM) dan Majlis Bandaraya Subang Jaya (MBSJ) menganjurkan Program Advokasi Kesedaran dan Pemerkasaan HIV dan AIDS Rakyat Malaysia.

Ia bertujuan bagi meningkatkan pemahaman masyarakat tentang penyakit itu, seterusnya

mengurangkan stigma dan diskriminasi terhadap penghidap atau individu yang hidup dengan penyakit ini.

Program itu juga turut melibatkan pelajar-pelajar kerja sosial di Fakulti Sains Sosial dan Kemanusiaan (FSSK), UKM.

PELUANG MANDIRI

Tambah Dr. Azahah, program yang mendapat tajaan geran daripada PKRM itu dapat membantu penghidap dan keluarga untuk mandiri dan tidak merasa dipinggirkan masyarakat.

"Pentingnya kurangkan stigma supaya mereka yang hidup dgn HIV dapat berdikari dan berjaya tanpa

merasa dipinggirkan dan terasing.

"Ia juga akan membuatkan mereka pergi dapatkan rawatan kesihatan di hospital tanpa rasa ragu-ragu, terutamanya jika mereka mempunyai anak yang juga hidup dengan HIV.

"Juga supaya keluarga dapat memberikan sokongan kepada mereka," ujarnya lagi.

Selain itu, katanya yang juga Ketua Projek, faktor budaya dan masyarakat turut memainkan peranan dalam membentuk sikap dan persepsi terhadap penyakit berkenaan.

Kurangnya kefahaman tentang langkah pencegahan menjadikan ramai yang menyisihkan golongan

tersebut.

Kebiasannya mereka mula menjauhkan diri dan kurang memberikan sokongan kepada pesakit dan keluarga.

"Penglibatan komuniti, termasuk kerjasama di antara UKM, PKRM, MBSJ, Yayasan Amal Malaysia, Kuala Lumpur AIDS Service Society, dan PERNIM merupakan asas kepada kejayaan program kesedaran dan advokasi HIV.

"Terutamanya dalam kalangan pelajar Program Kerja Sosial di PSITRA, FSSK, UKM," jelasnya.

Sementara itu, Pengarah Projek, Mohamad Hanif Mohamad Jani berkata, program sedemikian telah membuka matanya selain memberi ilmu dan pengalaman bermanfaat.

"Daripada projek ini, saya dapat simpulkan, ia telah memberi ilmu serta pengalaman yang amat bermanfaat dan pastinya satu kesedaran kepada saya sejajar dengan pandangan Abraham Maslow berkaitan kehidupan manusia.

"Mulai saat ini, marilah kita hidup dengan penuh kebahagiaan dengan sistem sosial kita.

"Raikan kepelbagaian dan hidup dengan penuh kasih sayang tanpa ada diskriminasi kepada persekitaran kerana setiap manusia mempunyai banyak pengalaman yang boleh dijadikan pedoman dan sempadan," katanya yang juga Pelajar Kerja Sosial UKM.

Struktur baharu gaji penjawat awam diumumkan dalam Belanjawan 2025

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PETALING JAYA: Keputusan penambahbaikan sistem struktur gaji 1.7 juta penjawat awam akan dibentangkan dalam Belanjawan 2025 yang dijangka Oktober tahun ini.

Jabatan Perkhidmatan Awam memaklumkan, cadangan penambahbaikan sistem struktur gaji penjawat awam dijangka dimuktamad dan dibentangkan dalam Mesyuarat Jemaah Menteri selewat-lewatnya awal suku kedua tahun ini untuk kelulusan.

Bagaimanapun kata JPA, penjawat awam di segenap lapisan perkhidmatan masih boleh mengemukakan cadangan penambahbaikan sistem saraan sedia ada meliputi segala aspek perkhidmatan melalui portal semakan saraan dilancarkan sejak 7 Ogos 2023 di pautan semakansaraan.jpa.gov.my sebelum 1 Mac ini.

"Cadangan penambahbaikan sistem struktur gaji penjawat awam dijangka dimuktamad dan dibentangkan dalam Mesyuarat Jemaah Menteri selewat-lewatnya pada awal suku kedua tahun ini untuk kelulusan.

"Keputusan ini dijangka diumumkan pada pembentangan Belanjawan 2025 pada tahun ini," katanya dalam kenyataan semalam.

HASIL kajian penambahbaikan sistem struktur gaji penjawat awam dijangka dibentangkan dalam Mesyuarat Jemaah Menteri selewat-lewatnya awal suku kedua tahun ini sebelum diumumkan dalam Belanjawan 2025.

Rakyat, pembentangan Rang Undang-Undang Perbekalan atau Belanjawan 2025 akan dibuat Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim selaku Menteri Kewangan pada 11 Oktober 2024.

Semalam, Ketua Setiausaha Negara, Tan Sri Mohd Zuki Ali berkata, Jabatan Perkhidmatan Awam kini dalam peringkat akhir bagi kajian pelaksanaan skim pensen penjawat awam (SSPA) sebelum ia dibawa ke

Jemaah Menteri untuk dimuktamadkan.

Beliau berkata, buat masa ini, tiada sebarang keputusan muktamad diambil berhubung pelaksanaan skim pensen itu, termasuk untuk menggantikannya dengan kaedah lain.

Kata beliau, ketika ini, Suruhanjaya Perkhidmatan Awam diberikan peruntukan untuk melantik penjawat awam baharu secara kontrak dahulu

untuk tempoh setahun atau setahun setengah.

Dalam pada itu, Jabatan Perkhidmatan Awam memaklumkan, Perdana Menteri telah mengemukakan Mesyuarat Jawatankuasa Induk Kajian Sistem Saran Perkhidmatan Awam Bilangan 2/2024 kelmarin yang turut dihadiri Menteri Kewangan II, Datuk Seri Amir Hamzah Azizan.

Katanya, mesyuarat tersebut membincang dan menimbang inisiatif-inisiatif penambahbaikan dalam Kajian Sistem Saran Perkhidmatan Awam terutama berkaitan dengan aspek meningkatkan pendapatan boleh guna penjawat awam.

"Penambahbaikan pendapatan boleh guna penjawat awam adalah salah satu fokus dalam pemerkasaan modal insan perkhidmatan awam untuk memangkin peningkatan produktiviti penjawat awam bagi merealisasikan aspirasi Malaysia Madani," katanya.

Menurut JPA, Perdana Menteri turut memberi penekanan kepada elemen-elemen pembaharuan perkhidmatan awam seperti pendigitalan sistem perkhidmatan dan kerjasama strategik yang holistik.

"Pendekatan *Whole-of-Nation* bagi memacu peningkatan kecekapan, keberkesanan dan profesionalisme perkhidmatan awam dalam memberi perkhidmatan terbaik kepada rakyat serta negara," katanya.

Prestasi ekonomi Malaysia 2023 masih baik dibanding negara ASEAN

KITA semua sedang menunggu pengumuman tentang kadar pertumbuhan ekonomi yang dicapai pada 2023. Ramai penganalisa antarabangsa meletakkan angka 3.4 hingga 3.8 peratus sebagai kadar pertumbuhan sebenar pada 2023. Ini mungkin mengecewakan sesetengah pihak. Namun ia merupakan satu realiti berasaskan apa yang telah dan sedang berlaku dalam ekonomi dunia dan Malaysia.

Mulai suku 2021, ekonomi Malaysia berkembang melebihi 3.6 peratus dan mencapai tahap 3.1 peratus untuk keseluruhan tahun tersebut. Malaysia berjaya keluar dari kegawatan ekonomi yang melanda negara lebih 15 bulan sejak Mac 2020.

Bila kita menamatkan tempoh penutupan ekonomi, ekonomi Malaysia mula tumbuh dengan pesat. Tahun 2022 merupakan tahun pemulihan yang pesat menunjukkan Malaysia mencapai tahap 8.7 peratus pertumbuhan.

Tahun 2023 sepatutnya merupakan lonjakan mengikut arah pusingan ekonomi yang menaik. Bagaimanapun, cabaran antarabangsa dengan kesan peperangan di Ukraine dan ekonomi Amerika Syarikat (AS) dan Eropah yang agak lemah menyebabkan eksport menurun dengan banyak walaupun import juga menurun.

Malaysia menunjukkan prestasi yang masih baik berbanding dengan negara jiran di ASEAN dan kebanyakan negara di dunia. Walaupun pertumbuhan agak lemah di suku kedua 2023 pada 2.9 peratus, namun ia meningkat menjadi 3.4 peratus di suku keempat 2023.

2024 dijangka akan merupakan satu lagi tahun yang mencabar bagi ekonomi Malaysia walaupun ramai penganalisa masih mempercayai bahawa prestasi ekonomi akan lebih baik dari 2023.

Angka eksport masih lagi menurun. Indeks

perindustrian juga menurun. Ini adalah kesan dari penurunan permintaan global khususnya ke atas keluaran elektrik dan elektronik - khususnya semikonduktor (walaupun ada bayangan peningkatan permintaan dari Eropah).

Bagaimanapun Malaysia masih menunjukkan arah peningkatan dalam Keluaran Dalam Negara Kasar (KDNK) berasaskan pada arus pusingan ekonomi yang berlaku di setiap 10 tahun. KDNK di jangka akan terus menaik sehingga 2026 sekurang-kurangnya. Selepas itu ekonomi Malaysia dijangka akan mencapai puncak dan ia akan mula menurun untuk empat hingga lima tahun selanjutnya berasaskan trend pusingan ekonomi normal dunia yang telah berlaku sejak beribu tahun dan dibuktikan berasaskan data statistik oleh Ravi Batra (1990) sejak 1780. Jadi, ekonomi Malaysia masih berpeluang untuk mencatat kadar pertumbuhan melebihi 4 peratus bagi 2024.

Dua sektor penting yang sedang berkembang dengan pesat memacu ekonomi ialah sektor perkhidmatan yang berkembang lebih 7.3 peratus pada 2023 yang meliputi pelancongan, logistik dan rantaian bekalan serta perkhidmatan kewangan.

Dan yang kedua ialah

sektor pembinaan yang berkembang lebih 5.5 peratus khususnya pembinaan perumahan swasta dan rumah mampu milik serta kontrak kerajaan di dalam beberapa projek mega.

TINGKAT INDUSTRI

Kerajaan perlu menggiatkan inisiatif bagi melonjakkan lagi kedua sektor di atas dan menonjolkan sektor keselamatan makanan bagi mencapai tahap pertumbuhan yang diharapkan. Keselamatan makanan perlu segera diisytiharkan sebagai sebuah industri baharu untuk menampung keperluan tempatan dan untuk meningkatkan eksport.

Industri padi umpamanya perlu disuntik dengan teknologi dan model pengurusan moden bagi meningkatkan purata hasil menjadi lebih dari 8 hingga 9 tan per hektar. Industri ayam dan telur perlu dipergiatkan melibatkan petani bidang kecil di kampung.

Aktiviti perladangan di negeri maju seperti Selangor perlu segera diubah suai menjadi industri tanaman sayur, buah-buahan, ternakan ikan, kambing dan lembu. Ini akan dilihat sebagai langkah positif mencapai matlamat yang berbilang.

Industri pelancongan perlu

dirombak bagi menjadikannya lebih produktif dan mesra pelancong termasuk aspek kualiti perkhidmatan dan kos perkhidmatan. Sasaran 35 juta pelancong pada 2024 akan menyumbang lebih RM140 billion kepada pendapatan negara.

Sektor logistik termasuk ekonomi gig memerlukan perhatian khusus untuk membantu melonjakkan permintaan penggunaan umum (persendirian).

Sektor perkhidmatan yang lain agak terganggu dengan pengumuman kenaikan kadar Cukai Jualan dan Perkhidmatan (SST) untuk perkhidmatan, termasuk perkhidmatan logistik, profesional dan perkhidmatan lain. Ini perlu ditangani segera bagi mengelakkan tahap penggunaan untuk perkhidmatan menurun.

Industri pembinaan memerlukan suntikan teknologi seperti pencetakan 3D dan sistem pembinaan rumah mampu milik yang mesra pengguna dengan menasarkannya harga yang benar-benar mesra kumpulan berpendapatan rendah iaitu kurang dari RM100,000. Ini boleh dilakukan jika kerajaan negeri dapat memberikan konsesi khas dalam bayaran premium dan kos pertukaran status dan nama pemilik.

Pertumbuhan ekonomi juga

akan dipacu oleh penggunaan awam dan persendirian di satu pihak yang lain. Untuk beberapa tahun kebelakangan ini, penggunaan persendirian memacu pertumbuhan ekonomi negara. Dengan sentimen dan keyakinan yang melonjak selepas keluar dari tempoh 'berkurung', isi rumah galak berbelanja dan ini memacu ekonomi di dalam tempoh tiga tahun yang lepas.

Kini tahap keyakinan pengguna dan sentimen untuk berbelanja menjadi semakin lemah. Ini boleh ditingkatkan lagi dengan meningkatkan keyakinan isi rumah dan pengguna tentang prospek ekonomi Malaysia. Permintaan domestik masih berkembang melebihi 4.8 peratus, memberi harapan cerah untuk membantu memacu pertumbuhan.

Pasaran buruh masih dilihat mengembang dengan kadar pengangguran yang rendah, kurang dari 3.4 peratus. Kadar inflasi juga rendah, kurang dari 1.9 peratus, jauh lebih rendah dari kadar di United Kingdom (UK) (6.7 peratus), Filipina (6.1 peratus), Singapura (4.1 peratus), AS (3.7 peratus) dan Indonesia (2.3 peratus).

Malah ada juga ahli ekonomi yang meramalkan kita sedang menuju ke tahap deflasi semula seperti yang dialami pada 2020. Ini agak jauh kemungkinan berlakunya selagi keyakinan pengguna dapat terus ditingkatkan.

Rumusnya, ekonomi Malaysia dijangka akan terus meningkat untuk tiga hingga empat akan datang. Minat untuk pembelian rumah dan hartanah mula meningkat, budaya membeli makanan secara penghantaran dan makan di luar dijangka akan terus meningkat selain budaya melancong masih kukuh walaupun ia menyerang kepada pelancongan luar negara seperti Thailand, Indonesia, Kemboja dan lain-lain.

Pelancongan dalam negeri masih boleh ditingkatkan dengan memujuk kembali pelancong dalam negeri untuk melancong ke banyak destinasi produk pelancongan yang menarik di dalam negara.

Asas ekonomi makin kukuh, pakar ekonomi tolak kemungkinan ringgit jatuh ke paras RM5

PETALING JAYA: Asas ekonomi negara yang makin kukuh menyebabkan penganalisis ekonomi menolak kemungkinan ringgit menyusut sehingga RM5 berbanding dolar Amerika Syarikat (AS) pada akhir bulan ini, mahupun suku pertama.

Bercakap kepada *Utusan Malaysia*, Pengarah Program Sarjana Pentadbiran Perniagaan (MBA), Prof. Madya Dr. Ahmed Razman Abdul Latiff berkata, kejatuhan ringgit ketika ini adalah kesan

daripada pengukuhan dolar AS.

Katanya, ringgit rendah kerana kadar faedah Rizab Persekutuan (Fed) AS yang masih kekal tinggi pada 5.5 peratus dan juga ekonomi negara China yang agak perlahan menyebabkan kurang sedikit permintaan terhadap barangan eksport negara.

"Jika ringgit terus jatuh, eksport negara akan menjadi lebih kompetitif tetapi kita harus mengurangkan kebergantungan kepada barangan import untuk

mengelakkan imbalan dagangan dan akaun semasa kita dari menjadi negatif

"Kejatuhan ringgit boleh mengakibatkan peningkatan harga barangan yang diimport.

"Selain itu, memandangkan makanan ayam majoritinya diimport, kenaikan harga makanan ayam boleh menyumbang kepada kenaikan harga ayam itu sendiri," katanya di sini, semalam.

Mengulas mengenai prestasi Bursa Malaysia pula, beliau

berkata, pasaran saham lebih dipengaruhi oleh prestasi syarikat tempatan yang mampu menjanjikan pulangan atas pelaburan seperti yang diharapkan dan juga sentimen pelabur itu sendiri.

"Kemungkinan ringgit yang lemah membolehkan pelabur asing masuk melabur dalam pasaran ekuiti kerana pelaburan mereka menjadi lebih murah

"Saya menjangkakan pasaran saham akan didagangkan sekitar 1,500 hingga 1525 hingga

akhir bulan ini," ujarnya.

Semalam, ringgit ditutup lebih rendah berbanding dolar AS pada 4.786/4.784 daripada 4.764/4.768 pada 5 petang, Selasa.

Sementara itu, Bursa Malaysia juga ditutup lebih rendah pada 1529.33, susut 2.04 mata berbanding 1,531.37 ketika ditutup kelmarin.

Kali terakhir Bursa Malaysia melepasi paras 1,530 mata ialah pada 27 September 2022 apabila ditutup 1,532.20 mata.

Firemen fear low water pressure amid scorching weather

KLANG: The biggest problem faced during the hot season is low water pressure, according to an assemblyman here.

"That is why the Fire Department goes around with huge water tankers to douse out fires as they don't solely depend on hydrants," said Port Klang assemblyman Azmizam Zaman Huri.

He said some areas in his constituency, such as Telok Gong, used to have low pressure issues, but the problem is being countered by Air Selangor with the installation of new underground pipes.

"Some of the pipes here are about 40 years old and they burst if the water pressure is too high. These pipes are being replaced and are still being replaced."

According to Azmizam, the former Klang Municipal Council, now known as the Royal Klang City Council (MBDK), also makes it a point to go around fire-prone areas during the hot season.

"Their Pantas squad goes around these areas and when a fire is spotted, they put it out immediately. Most of the time, this prevents the fire from spreading," he said.

Second-term Pandamaran assemblyman Tony Leong said some parts of his area are

more prone to fire as the structures there are mostly wooden.

"I remember a fire in an open space in Port Klang in 2021 and when the fire engines arrived, the water pressure in the hydrant was low," said Leong.

When he spoke to Air Selangor and the Fire and Rescue Department following the incident, added Leong, he was told the pressure was okay but the pipes were old and some of the hydrants had been vandalised.

"There are some copper parts in the hydrants and these are often stolen, which impacts their (the hydrants') functionality," said Leong.

He hopes the government will allocate more funds so that the low pressure issue can be countered with the replacement of old pipes.

Meanwhile, MBDK Environmental Services Department director Zaireezal Ahmad Zainuddin said the council always cooperates with the Fire and Rescue Department, which is in charge of fire hydrants.

"We always help in the event there is a need," he said.

Extended deadline for Titiwangsa eatery to vacate leaves sour taste

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TAMAN Tasik Titiwangsa residents are angry over another extension to an order to vacate issued to an illegal food court in their housing area in Kuala Lumpur.

The operator was supposed to vacate by Feb 14 but has now been given until Feb 29 to do so.

The operator has been served three eviction notices by Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur Land and Mines Office (PTGWP).

The latest notice was issued on Feb 5, and *StarMetro* carried a report on this on Feb 9.

In a statement, PTGWP said the first notice was issued on April 8, 2023, and the second on Jan 4 this year.

It added that an investigation found several structures built illegally on government land including an eatery, workshop, *surau* and office.

A meeting was held to discuss the issue on Feb 9, involving the operator and agencies such as Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL), Federal Territories Islamic Religious Council (MAIWP) and Setiawangsa MP Nik Nazmi Nik Ahmad's office.

"Following the meeting, the operator agreed to vacate but asked for extra time to move

wares from the site.

"The request was granted with Feb 29 as the new deadline," said PTGWP, adding that the operator was to bear any cost involved.

However, the extension has drawn backlash from residents who want sterner action.

Resident Ng Man Fai said the lack of action despite multiple notices served created an impression of double standards.

"DBKL has carried out many raids on illegal roadside hawkers in nearby Jalan Kuantan but this food court has remained untouched," he added.

Another resident, Wan Hilwanie Ariff, said multiple complaints to DBKL since October 2021 had fallen on deaf ears.

"After several engagements, in October 2023 DBKL finally said

the eatery falls under PTGWP's jurisdiction instead," she said.

The issue gained attention after a *StarMetro* report on May 17, 2023, highlighting complaints by residents who were concerned about hygiene, traffic congestion and noise problems caused by the food court, which began operating in 2021.

DBKL had said that the eatery, which was operated by a non-profit group, was built without a development order.

However, the non-profit group, in a follow-up report on Aug 25, 2023, denied it was operating illegally, adding it was negotiating for approval with the authorities.

In a Dec 18 report, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim's aide Datuk Azman Abidin said the food court was operating without a licence.

Lorong Maarof folk worried over messy project site

Debris, sand from Bangsar infrastructure work pose safety hazard

RESIDENTS near Lorong Maarof, Lorong Maarof 1 and Jalan Maarof in Bangsar, Kuala Lumpur, are worried about hazards posed by ongoing construction work near a road leading to Bangsar LRT station.

The work involves pipe laying, drain upgrades and improvements to public walkways.

Residents said debris was carelessly left by the side of the road near the project site.

A. Selvadurai said, "The debris needs to be cleared away and the area should be cordoned off with sandbags."

Bukit Bandaraya residents association advisor Datuk M. Ali said he had received numerous safety-related complaints.

"At night, there are no signs or road construction blinkers to alert motorists and pedestrians."

"We eventually found blinkers buried under sand and dust."

StarMetro found a lot of mess during a visit to the site on Monday.

Signs lay toppled on the ground and traffic construction blinkers, designed to warn of nighttime hazards, were buried under rubble.

The walkway was obstructed by additional construction debris, and newly dug trenches were inadequately covered with planks, posing risks to pedestrians, particularly after dark.

Of greater concern was a mound of sand that had washed into drains and manholes, blocking water flow and potentially leading to flash floods if undressed.

"We urge Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) to intervene and instruct the contractor to adopt

better maintenance practices," Ali said.

In response, a representative from the project contractor, Muhd Hafizuddin, explained that many difficulties were faced transporting sand and debris during weekends due to a DBKL regulation prohibiting lorries

from entering residential areas during festivals.

"Our workers are instructed to sweep the area daily to uphold cleanliness," Hafizuddin said, assuring residents that proactive engagement with affected households would be held and that safety protocols would be

strictly followed.

The infrastructure project, initiated in June last year, is slated for completion in April.

Ali also raised concerns about an upcoming power cable-laying project for a nearby development, saying that residents were not consulted.

"Lorong Maarof is not suitable for cable laying due to it being a core residential neighbourhood."

He proposed Jalan Maarof as a more suitable alternative road as it was wider, and urged DBKL to hold an engagement session with stakeholders to properly address the matter.

PETALING JAYA: With the dry and hot weather expected to continue until May, concerns have emerged on the country's preparedness against fire-related emergencies.

One chief concern is the serviceability of the tens of thousands of fire hydrants in the country.

Adding fuel to the fire are the sale of sub-standard or even outright fake fire extinguishers that are flooding the market.

While fire hydrants are usually accessible to only firemen, fire extinguishers are often the first line of defence in firefighting and saving property, life and limb.

As such, are all the fire extinguishers being marketed by various parties worthy and fit for emergencies?

A resident of USJ, Subang Jaya, who only wanted to be known as Wendy, told *The Star* that she had purchased two fire extinguishers from an e-commerce website for her area's residents association and was disappointed when both failed on her.

She said it was fortunate that she discovered the fire extinguishers she had acquired were useless in putting out flames during a firefighting demonstration by the Fire and Rescue Department.

Wendy said that during the demonstration, the dry powder in both 6kg fire extinguishers failed to put out a fire.

"I chose to buy from the e-commerce merchant since they sold many other hardware and household items.

"It was also convenient as it was delivered to my doorstep. When I complained to the seller, they were very irresponsible and refused to give me a refund. My advice is to never buy cheap fire extinguishers sold by unauthorised sellers," she said.

Fire and Rescue Department director-general Datuk Nor Hisham Mohammad said those purchasing fire extinguishers online should look for the Sirim Bhd verification and the manufacturer's information.

He explained that fire extin-

guishers also have to abide by the MS 1539 Malaysian standard.

"The list of fire extinguisher manufacturers registered with the Fire and Rescue Department can be found on the e-Feis portal," he said when contacted.

Nor Hisham also encouraged households to own at least one fire extinguisher.

"This will allow early action to be taken when small fires break out.

"The Fire and Rescue Depart-

ment is also organising a campaign encouraging the public to own at least one fire extinguisher at home," he added.

Nor Hisham said dry powder fire extinguishers are the most suitable to be used at home, as they can put out all classes of fire.

He added that there are several types of extinguishers, with each type being able to extinguish different classes of fire.

In general, there are six classes of fires - A, B, C, D, E and F.

Fire extinguishers are also labelled with symbols or letters, indicating the types of fires they can put out.

A is for fires from combustible materials like wood, paper and fabric; B for fires involving flammable liquids like oil, petrol, varnish, cooking gas and paint; C for flammable gases; D for metal gas; E for fires involving electrical appliances; and F for fires involving cooking oil or fats.

To be certain of their serviceability, fire extinguishers should have a certificate of inspection issued by the Fire and Rescue Department attached to it, said Roy Chua, a fire extinguisher dealer and maintenance contractor.

"The certificate has a QR code that gives details of the owner and the servicing done on the cylinder. Regular maintenance of fire extinguishers is crucial.

"Over time, the dry powder can 'cake up' or harden. The fire extinguisher can also lose pressure. All these can render a fire extinguisher useless during a fire emergency," he said.

Apart from sub-standard fire extinguishers flooding the market, Chua said there are also unscrupulous maintenance contractors who offer servicing at cheap prices but do not carry out the necessary work required.

"I have heard of some bad experiences my clients had undergone with other contractors. In some cases, these irres-

ponsible individuals take the fire extinguishers away, supposedly for servicing, and just disappear.

"On other occasions, they return the cylinders with fake Fire and Rescue Department certificates and without carrying out any maintenance.

"The customers will never know until an emergency arises and the fire extinguishers malfunction," said Chua, who is manager of Kuala Lumpur-based PR Fire Service.

He said every household should have a fire extinguisher as it can save one from a deadly situation.

"Always buy from reputable companies that specialise in firefighting equipment and do not be 'penny wise, pound foolish.' It is a small price to pay for our safety.

"It is best to own at least two fire extinguishers, one for the front and another for the back of a house, or a third one or more for upper floors," Chua told *The Star*.

On Tuesday, Housing and Local Government Minister Nga Kor Ming said the Fire and Rescue Department has been instructed to carry out a massive operation to inspect and ensure the 400,000 fire hydrants in the country are in working order.

He stressed that water pressure from hydrants should also be adequate to help douse fires, especially during the current dry and hot weather.

Nga said scheduled checks are being carried out by the 337 fire stations nationwide, but starting today, the efforts must be intensified to make sure that the pressure from the hydrants is adequate.

On Tuesday, the Fire and Rescue Department said a faulty hose reel system had hampered firefighting efforts in a fire that broke out at the Sri Sabah flats in Cheras, Kuala Lumpur, on Sunday.

No casualties were reported but five residential units on the 17th floor of the flats were destroyed in the fire that the department believes was caused by faulty electrical wiring.

Recently, she had said Syafeera will be assisted in the panel by two senior officials of the Attorney General's Chambers: Mohd Nasruddin Mohamad, who will be the deputy president, and Nurul Elida Baharudin, the secretary.

The tribunal will be housed at the ministry here.

"It has been in the works for a long time and this year, the tribunal will be up and running," said Nancy.

The tribunal provides an alternative platform for victims of sexual harassment instead of them taking the matter to the courts and instituting criminal proceedings.

Nancy previously said it would provide cheaper and quicker redress for sexual harassment complaints.

The tribunal is part of the Anti-Sexual Harassment Act passed in Parliament in August 2022.

NARATHIWAT province in Thailand is the destination of choice for Malaysian civil servants looking to secretly wed a second wife, according to a marriage agent, *Kosmo!* reported.

Nikah (marriage) agent Azrul said he arranges for the marriage of at least one civil servant, including those in senior positions, every month there.

"Many civil servants who chose to marry a second wife in Thailand have the financial means to do so. They normally are in their 40s or 50s, with adult children.

"It's just that they are scared to inform their first wife of their intention to take another spouse, so they choose to do so in Thailand as an alternative to legitimising

their second marriage."

The agent, with about 10 years' experience, said many civil servants started using his services after he was referred to by a former client in 2021.

'MySpike development shows quality of civil servants'

PUTRAJAYA: The expertise of the Human Resources Ministry in developing the Malaysia Skills Integration Management System (MySpike) reflects the efficiency in its service delivery, says Steven Sim.

The Human Resources Minister, in his speech at the ministry's monthly assembly here, said the workforce is its most valuable asset.

"People used to think that civil servants cannot develop any system on their own.

"So, we (the government) have to appoint contractors.

To enhance the performance of the ministry, Sim also encouraged its personnel to apply the philosophy of "Ren" and "Li", which are principles rooted in Chinese society, in carrying out their daily tasks.

Quoting the Confucian concept and teaching to improve morality and uphold human ethics, he said "Ren" means love and humanity, while "Li" refers to rituals or propriety.

At the assembly yesterday, he also welcomed the newly appointed secretary-general Datuk Seri Khairul Dzalmee Daud, who joined the ministry on Jan 23.

"Welcome aboard! I was told that despite him being a new appointee, the new secretary-general has been going to the ground (to meet with the staff). I appreciate his dedication," Sim added.

Review of salary structure to be part of Budget 2025

KUALA LUMPUR: The decision on improving the civil service salary structure system is expected to be announced during the tabling of Budget 2025 this year, says the Public Service Department (PSD).

The meeting discussed and deliberated on improvement initiatives within the Review of the Public Service Remuneration System (SSPA), especially concerning boosting the disposable income of public servants.

It added that Anwar also emphasised elements of civil service reforms such as digitising service systems, holistic strategic cooperation, and the whole-of-nation approach.

Govt to build 50^{15/2} public parks per year^{Sun}

IPOH: The Housing and Local Government Ministry aims to build at least 50 public recreational parks each year nationwide with an allocation of about RM500,000 for each, said its minister Nga Kor Ming.

Civil service salary review to be announced during Budget 2025 tabling

KUALA LUMPUR: The decision on the civil service salary scheme improvement is expected to be announced during the tabling of the 2025 Budget, said the Public Service Department (PSD).

enhancing the disposable income of public servants.

It said improving the disposable income is one of the focuses to enhance human capital empowerment of the public service to boost productivity to realise Malaysia *Madani* aspirations.

INCREASE IN DISPOSABLE INCOME?

PSD: NEW PAY SCHEME OUTCOME BY OCTOBER

Revised salary
scheme details to
be unveiled during
tabling of 2025
Budget

KUALA LUMPUR

THE proposed improvements to the public service remuneration scheme are expected to be presented to the cabinet in the second quarter of this year, said the Public Service Department (PSD).

It said a decision on the matter was expected to be announced during the tabling of the 2025 Budget in the Dewan Rakyat in October.

"The prime minister (Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim) chaired the civil service remuneration scheme review committee on Feb 3, that was also attended by the finance minister II (Datuk Seri Amir Hamzah Azizan)," it said in statement.

The committee discussed enhancements to the civil service remuneration scheme, especially in improving civil servants' disposable income, it said.

PSD said this measure was meant to boost the civil service's human capital and improve its productivity to realise the Malaysia Madani aspirations.

"Civil servants of all levels can still submit their suggestions to semakansaraan.jpa.gov.my before March 1.

"The prime minister also emphasised on the elements of civil service reform, such as digitalisation of the delivery system, holistic strategic cooperation and the whole-of-nation approach to drive efficiency, effectiveness and professionalism of the civil service in giving its best to the people and country."

The government plans to introduce a new remuneration scheme to tackle the ballooning public sector bill for wages and pensions. Among the plans is for new civil service hires to not have pensions, and instead contribute to the Employees Provident Fund and Social Security Organisation.

Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi had said the government had to come up with a new system to reduce the government's financial commitments.

He had said the government was expected to spend RM120 billion on pensions by 2040 if the existing system was maintained.

Zahid had said the large amount would impose a long-term burden on the government, particularly on Retirement Fund Inc, which might face challenges in ensuring its investments gave sufficient returns.

Civil servants and the public have pushed back on these proposals, saying politicians and political appointees should be the first to give up their pensions.

Some quarters said civil servants were crucial to the running of the government and deserved to be remunerated fairly.

In response, Anwar had said pensions of those holding political positions would also be done away with, but the matter was being studied before a final decision. He had said new laws would have to be drawn up, and be debated and passed in Parliament before a new government remuneration scheme could be introduced.

He said that this was something that had to be done and that previous governments had warned that the nation's economic growth could not be sustained if no changes were made.

Anwar urged all quarters to consider the suggestions before rejecting them.

Several politicians have volunteered to give up their pensions to support the proposed reform.

KLANG VALLEY PROPERTIES TO SEE UP TO 20pc RENTAL HIKE

Possibility of even further increases as demand picks up after MCO, say property agents

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RENTALS for properties in the Klang Valley are expected to see an increase of 10 to 20 per cent this year, with some property agents not excluding the possibility of further increments.

Real estate agent Jonathan Kiang Kai Ming said rentals were picking up after recording a significant reduction during the Movement Control Order (MCO) following the Covid-19 pandemic. He added that rentals were currently higher than the pre-Covid period.

"Last year and this year we saw an increase in rental rates. During MCO the rental rate was low but it is picking up. The rental rate (now) is higher than during the pre-Covid period," he said.

Depending on the location, rentals can go up between 10 and 20 per cent.

"Areas that are picking up quickly include Bangsar, Bangsar

South, Month Kiara, Damansara Heights and KLCC," said Kiang, who has been in the real estate line for five years.

Property negotiator Nurul Nadia Syidha Abd Raof said it was normal for rentals to go up every year, especially when the economy grows.

"Normally the increase will be five to 10 per cent or around RM50 to RM100 for rental houses that cost around RM1,000 per month," said Nurul, who handles sales and rents around Selangor and Nilai.

She said the rise in rental was also a response by owners to cope with the increased overnight policy rate (OPR).

"When OPR increases they have to pay higher loan installment, hence they raise the rent."

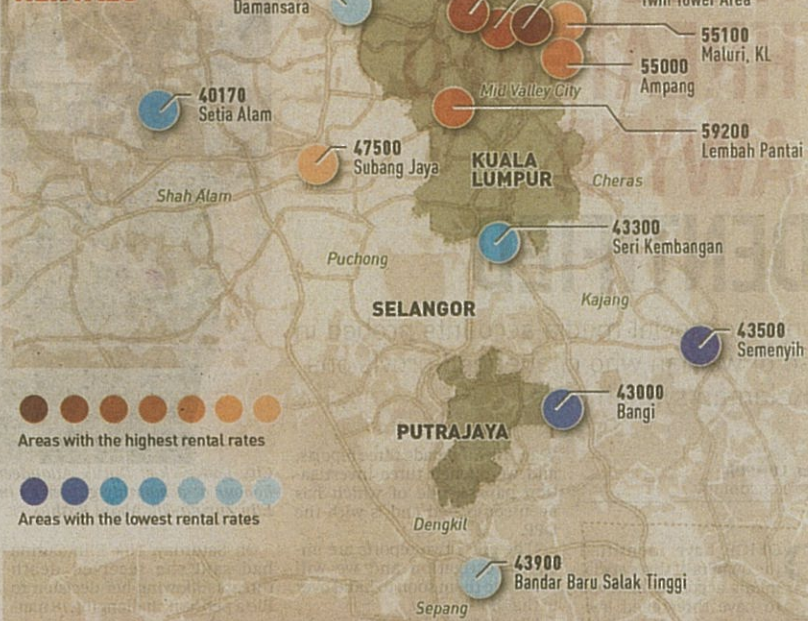
"But it is normal to have the rental increase every year, especially as the economy is recovering from Covid-19," she said.

Nurul said areas experiencing a rise in rental rates typically include those in proximity to public transportation, condominiums connected to malls and main cities.

Asked about the possibility of an additional increase this year, Nurul said it would depend on various factors, including the economy and public demand.

"I think there might be an increase, but it won't be too significant and sudden," she added.

LOCATIONS WITH HIGH AND LOW RENTALS



Wong Whei Meng, the chief executive officer of Speedhome, a platform for renting out real estate, said the average rental rate across the Klang Valley had steadily increased by up to 20 per cent in 2023, compared with 2020, which was during the Covid-19 pandemic.

This year, it has increased between three and five per cent.

He, however, believed that there would not be any additional rental hike this year.

"Those up for renewal (their tenancy agreements having expired sometime this year) will experience some hike," he said.

Wong said among areas with high rental rates include Jalan Ampang, Jalan Binjal, Jalan Changkat Kia Peng, Jalan Conlay, Bukit Ledang, Bukit Tunku, Cangkat Damansara, Desa Sri Hartamas, Jalan Bukit Nenas, Jalan Chendana, Jalan P. Ramlee and Jalan Sultan Ismail.

The high rental rates may be attributed to a growing preference for larger units, driven by factors like an area's maturity — meaning it has been fully developed — as well as accessibility, lifestyle and the demand for fully furnished accommodation.

Wong said Kapar, Dengkil and

Semenyih were increasing favoured locations, primarily due to their affordability, offering monthly rental rates ranging between RM1,300 and RM1,400.

"These areas and those adjacent to them are a good balance distance and cost of living, certainly an area to pay attention to (for its potential to grow)."

Wong said a few proposed developments in the Klang Valley were expected to affect property rentals. These included the Light Rail Transit Line 3 (LRT3), the Rapid Transit Line 3 (MRT3) and the Kuala Lumpur-Singapore High Speed Rail (HSR) project.

"The Malaysia My Second Home programme too will certainly impact property prices as it reduces overhang at the high-end market," he added.

Klang Valley tenants concerned about paying more for rent

NEWS of the surge in rentals this year has sparked concern among Klang Valley residents.

A resident, who only wished to be known as Junaidi, said his landlord had not indicated that he would raise the rent.

Junaidi, however, admitted that any increase will undoubtedly pose a challenge for tenants.

"If there is an increase, it will definitely raise my cost of living."

"We already have many new taxes, including digital tax, to pay. If we buy stuff online, we will have to pay tax (low-value goods tax) and some services are already experiencing price hikes."

"So, I might spend more time at home if there is this additional cost of higher rent," said the 27-year-old, who is a writer.

Junaidi, who rents a property in Subang Jaya, said he was pay-

ing RM1,700 a month for his house which he has been living in for the past two years.

Siti Nur Najihah Baharudin, 26, said a rent hike would compel her to adjust her monthly spending.

She is, however, relieved that her landlord has not signalled any possible rent hike.

"I would be disappointed if there is an increase in my rent as I

have been renting here for two years."

"Such an increase will affect my savings and increase my commitment."

"So, I would have to readjust my financial spending every month," said the F&B worker who pays RM350 a month for a room in Bangsar.

Siti Rasyidah Zainuddin, 25, said her landlord had increased

the rent, but the amount was bearable since she was renting home in Kampung Datuk Keamat with six other tenants.

"I am lucky that the increase is not a lot, only RM100, but still increases my monthly spending bill."

"But I'm not really affected too much because we could split the bill if the rent goes up," said a anti-money laundering analyst.
