SHAH ALAM - Majlis Bandaraya Subang Jaya menganjurkan Subang Jaya Half Marathon di perkarangan pusat beli-belah Subang Parade mulai jam 4 pagi pada 23 Februari.

Datuk Bandar Dato' Amirul Azizan Abd Rahim berkata pertandingan itu melibatkan larian separa maraton 21 kilometer (km), 10km, 5km dan 5km cabaran kerusi roda untuk orang kurang upaya.

Tutup ladang gagal urus sisa tinja

SHAH ALAM - Sebuah ladang ternakan ayam pedaging diarah tutup selepas gagal menangani pencemaran bau berikutan longgokan tinja yang tidak diurus mengikut tatacara.

Menurut Majlis Perbandaran Hulu Selangor (MPHS), pemilik ladang diminta mengatasi masalah itu dalam masa tujuh hari selepas serahan notis pada 10 Januari sebelum premis diarahkan tutup.

"Pemantauan pada 25 Januari mendapati pemilik ladang gagal menghapuskan kcau ganggu pencemaran bau, malah melanggar arahan penutupan dengan membawa masuk kira-kira 80,000 anak ayam baharu ke reban.

"Kegagalan pemilik ladang mematuhi arahan menunjukkan sikap tidak cakna dalam menyelesaikan isu pencemaran bau dan kcau ganggu yang timbul sehingga menyebabkan orang awam membuat aduan," kata MPHS.

E-SCOOTER services may soon be available at SS15, Subang Jaya, in Selangor, offering a vital link for first- and last-mile connectivity to the local rail network for residents and visitors alike.

Subang Jaya assemblyman Michelle Ng advised companies interested in providing such services in SS15 to present their proposals to Subang Jaya City Council (MBSJ).

"The Malaysian Institute of Road Safety Research (Miros) granted MBSJ approval to implement the micromobility sandbox in SS15 at a meeting on Dec 16, 2024.



Ng: This approval, for one year, allows micromobility service providers to apply for the necessary permissions to operate within SS15.

"This approval, for one year, allows micromobility service providers, such as e-scooter companies, to apply for the necessary permissions to operate within SS15," she said.

Miros describes the micromobility sandbox as a comprehensive governance system enabling local councils to conduct trials on designated routes for a specified duration.

"While the law prohibits e-scooter usage on public roads without prior approval, the Transport Ministry has the authority to grant exemptions, which is the case here with MBSJ," said Ng.

To participate, companies must submit their proposals to MBSJ's Town Planning Department and comply with the Micromobility Vehicle Route Planning Guidelines set forth by the Town and Country Planning Department (PlanMalaysia) to get approval.

"Micromobility services play a vital role in enhancing first- and last-mile connectivity to rail stations.

"By introducing these services in SS15, we hope to reduce the number of cars in this bustling commercial area, thus alleviating traffic congestion and addressing parking shortages," she said.

Ng hoped Miro's would consider establishing a similar sandbox for the Taipan commercial area in USJ10 after MBSJ completes its pedestrian walkway improvements there.

She was speaking to reporters after inspecting the Sang Seni 15 project in SS15, where 12 pillars at the SS15 LRT Station were painted with colourful murals.

The Sang Seni 15 project aims to improve user experience for pedestrians and motorists, highlight the talents of local artists and combat vandalism of LRT pillars.

It was initiated by Ng's office, in collaboration with Prasarana Integrated Development Sdn Bhd (PRIDE), a subsidiary of Prasarana that looks into increasing the group's non-fare revenue, and curator Quest Studio.

On another matter, Ng said she used RM250,000 from her Projek Selangor Penyayang (PSP) allocation to improve the bicycle lane from the Subang Jaya LRT Station to SS15 LRT Station.

Ng said was only Phase I of the entire project's implementation, and that the bicycle lane would be extended with each year's allocation.

PSP is an annual state allocation for the maintenance and upgrade of government infrastructure and public facilities.

"The purpose of the bicycle lane is similar to the micromobility sandbox: to improve first- and last-mile connectivity to rail stations and reduce dependence on car usage.

"Once our network of bicycle lanes is complete, we anticipate a significant increase in bicycle usage across Subang Jaya," added Ng.

Looking ahead, she said subsequent phases of the bicycle lane project would be designed based on feedback from local communities and professionals.

"Due to budget constraints, the bicycle lane will be implemented in areas between SS12 and SS15. But I hope to expand the network from the SS to USJ areas," she said.

Pickleball courts now feature at DBKL community halls

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PICKLEBALL enthusiasts can now play at public community and multipurpose halls in Kuala Lumpur.

Pickleball courts have been set up at halls managed by Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) and can be rented at affordable rates, said Youth and Sports Minister Hannah Yeoh.

She said private pickleball court rentals typically cost about RM70.

DBKL has set the rates at RM40 per hour for closed courts and RM25 per hour for open courts.

"This is a more affordable rate and it could encourage more people to participate.

"We are not here just to promote pickleball. As a government, we recognise growing

interest in the sport.

"If this is what people are actively seeking, we will do our best to provide access to the necessary facilities," she said after launching the "Jom Pickleball" event in Kuala Lumpur.

Yeoh said the ministry has received numerous requests for more pickleball facilities.

"We are happy that a local authority like DBKL has been one of the first to respond quickly."

The Segambut MP said two halls have been made available for the sport in her constituency.

"We want to ensure that every government facility is used by the people," she said.

Regarding affordability, Yeoh hoped rental could be further reduced.

She said as more facilities became available, rental charges

would naturally decrease.

She also said the ministry had been in discussions with Tenaga Nasional Bhd to further reduce electricity charges for sports facilities.

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A CRACKDOWN by Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) that saw the demolition of illegal structures like concrete planter boxes, awnings and seating decks along Jalan Medan Setia 1, Bukit Damansara, has sparked outrage.

Business owners are upset over what they describe as heavy-handed tactics and lack of communication by the authorities.

One of the affected business owners who did not want to be named argued that the extensions were intended to improve the area's appearance and cleanliness.

"The planter boxes and awnings in some shops were meant to beautify the space.

"They enhanced the walkway and added greenery, which benefitted both customers and the community," she said.

"DBKL should have engaged with us first instead of resorting to demolition."

A restaurant operator who only wanted to be identified as Abidin was disappointed with the lack of communication from DBKL prior to the demolition.

"We took over the shop from previous owners and the extensions were already there. In fact, they had been in place since the building's construction."

"There should have been proper engagement with us.

"We are not a small stall; we are a business worth millions of ringgit. This could have been handled better," added Abidin.

S. Mani, another affected business owner, criticised the operation as unnecessary and excessive.

"This was nothing but senseless destruction. Everything could have been resolved with proper engagement.

Another business owner Anna Wong alleged that roadside stalls were left untouched while their legitimate businesses that paid taxes were targeted.

"We're trying to maintain and improve the area, yet they come down hard on us," she added.

The joint operation involved 162 personnel from DBKL and various agencies, including the police, Tenaga Nasional Bhd, Air

Selangor, SWCorp and Alam Flora.

The affected areas were Jalan Medan Setia 1 and nearby lanes.

Lorries, tractors and other departmental vehicles were utilised to remove the illegal structures.

DBKL enforcement officers, who carried out the two-day operation starting Wednesday, defended the move, stating that the structures obstructed a public walkway.

Its Enforcement Department spokesperson told *StarMetro* that the obstructions hindered cleaning efforts by waste management company Alam Flora.

"Several businesses constructed illegal structures outside their premises including planter boxes

and awnings.

"The structures may be aesthetically pleasing but they blocked public pathways and made it difficult for maintenance and cleaning of drains to be carried out."

DBKL maintained that notices for the operation were issued and owners should have been aware.

It cited Section 46(1)(d) of Street, Drainage, and Building Act 1974 and the Kuala Lumpur Hawker By-Laws 2016 as the legal basis for the enforcement.

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'Developers must give back to communities'

Contributions to proposed housing fund for enhancement of amenities to be based on scale and value of projects, says FT Minister

DEVELOPERS building residential projects in Kuala Lumpur will soon be required to contribute to a housing fund, in a radical move to improve community infrastructure and amenities.

The money collected under this initiative would be channelled towards developing public facilities such as parks, playgrounds and clinics, and upgrading infrastructure in the neighbourhoods where these projects are located, said Dr Zaliha Mustafa.

The Minister in the Prime Minister's Department in charge of Federal Territories said under the public funding scheme, developers would contribute based on the scale and value of their projects.

These contributions will directly support enhancements to community infrastructure and amenities in the areas they develop.

"This fund is designed to address the increasing demand for infrastructure and services brought about by population growth and higher vehicle usage resulting from new developments," Dr Zaliha told *StarMetro* in an interview.

"Developers have a collective responsibility to give back to the communities where they build by upgrading and supporting local amenities."

Dr Zaliha said the percentage of contribution had yet to be decided, adding that it would depend on the size and scope of each developer's project.

"For example, if Developer A is constructing 5,000 residential units and Developer B is building 3,000 units in the same area, their respective contributions will be determined based on their project size. This approach ensures that each developer shares the responsibility equitably," she said.

"By contributing to the maintenance of facilities such as drainage, parks, and playgrounds, the developers can play an active role in supporting the city's infrastructure."

"This is a shared responsibility that goes beyond profit-making, fostering a collaborative effort to improve and sustain community facilities for the benefit of all."

Emphasising that the initiative would take off soon, Dr Zaliha said when she engaged with several developers regarding the initiative, most of them were receptive to the idea of the housing fund.

However, she said further discussions were required to finalise the details of the fund.

Dr Zaliha said she has asked city planners to explore this initiative in detail and devise a suitable mechanism.

"The government will kick-start the fund with an initial allocation from the federal budget, but developers must also fulfil their obligation towards the community."

(Under the Federal Capital Act 1960, the Federal Territories Minister has the authority to make decisions on funding and launch initiatives to improve life in Kuala Lumpur).

Dr Zaliha said with the govern-

ment actively promoting the Urban Redevelopment Act (URA), many older areas in the city would require redevelopment, and the housing fund would be vital to supporting these efforts.

The housing fund requirement would affect both current and future developments in the city.

When contacted, the Real Estate and Housing Developers Association (Rehda) Federal Territories (Kuala Lumpur) branch said it fully supported Dr Zaliha's initiative to establish a fund for city infrastructure.

However, Rehda KL chairman Carrie Fong said the association had yet to get specific details regarding the proposed fund.

She said provisions for facilities and parks, along with charges and other forms of contributions, have been included in the development plans.

"It would be more conducive to business operations if this housing fund could replace other existing contributions," she said in a statement.

"If developers end up contributing to this fund while still fulfilling existing conditions and commitments, we risk passing these costs on to housebuyers."

Meanwhile, Kuala Lumpur residents warmly welcomed Dr Zaliha's planned initiative.

They believe that developers must do more to address the needs of growing townships, particularly in areas where population density is increasing.

Kampung Malaysia Raya Residents Association chairman Mohd Zainuddin Amran said even if developers cross-subsidised their projects by including affordable homes, they must understand that more housing

units bring more people and vehicles into the area.

"This creates greater demand for facilities such as parking, schools, clinics, and recreational parks. Developers need to contribute more to support these developments."

1Razak Mansion Management Corporation chairman Anthony Tan voiced concerns over the inadequate infrastructure and public services in the Salak South neighbourhood.

"There are about 20,000 residents within a 1km radius of 1Razak Mansion and Razak City Residences."

"Yet, we are still lacking essential infrastructure like proper access roads, pedestrian walkways, and a government clinic," he said.

Tan criticised the long-delayed pedestrian walkway project con-

necting 1Razak Mansion to Sungai Besi highway and Salak Selatan LRT station, which he said had stalled due to budget constraints.

"Residents have been waiting for years for this walkway, but every time we ask for updates, the response is the same - there's no funding."

"So this news for developers contributing to a fund for the benefit of residents is welcome."

Devi Subramaniam, who recently moved from Seremban to Kuala Lumpur, shared her struggles in accessing healthcare due to an overcrowded clinic in her new home in Sungai Besi.

"Klinik Kesihatan Sungai Besi is overcrowded and struggling to cope with the rising population and the wait time is too long," she said, adding that making developers contribute to building facilities like clinics was the right move.

MACC officers to head integrity units

Move to be done in stages and aims to address ministries' governance issues

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PUTRAJAYA: Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) officers will soon take on the role of heads of integrity units across all ministries, says Tan Sri Azam Baki.

The MACC Chief Commissioner said the deployment of these officers would be carried out in stages.

He said the proposal had been approved during a recent meeting of the Governance Committee chaired by the Chief Secretary to the Government Tan Sri Shamsul Azri Abu Bakar.

"This initiative aims to address the challenges faced by ministries in managing governance issues.

"MACC officers assigned to ministries will be recognised integrity officers with the relevant certifications" he said during a press conference at the MACC head-



quarters yesterday.

Meanwhile, Azam said 62 local authorities have already established integrity units and another

84 have appointed integrity liaison officers.

He said the MACC had opened 107 investigation papers on gov-

ernance investigations last year, with 69 recommendations for improvements submitted to the relevant parties.

Azam also launched the National Anti-Corruption Strategy (NACS) Dashboard, designed to allow the public to monitor the progress of each sub-strategy under the responsibility of all 19 lead agencies involved in NACS.

"This dashboard enables the public to track completed sub-strategies under NACS, providing summaries and insights into their effectiveness, whether through research findings, policies, or legal aspects", Azam added.

Currently, most ministries have an Integrity Unit under the Prime Minister's Department's Governance, Integrity and Anti-Corruption Centre framework.

These units promote integrity, prevent corruption, and handle misconduct within their respective ministries.

Civil servants typically lead these existing units from within the ministries themselves.

SPRM kaji maklumat DBKL

Jamin siasat secepat mungkin isu dakwaan melibatkan Afdlin Shauki

Suruhanjaya Pencegahan Rasuah Malaysia (SPRM) sedang mengkaji maklumat berkaitan dakwaan salah laku seorang ahli lembaga penasihat Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) yang dikaitkan dengan pemberian projek bernilai RM4 juta.

Ketua Pesuruhjaya SPRM, Tan Sri Azam Baki berkata, pihaknya memberi jaminan siasatan akan dilakukan secepat mungkin sekiranya terdapat unsur rasuah.

Bagaimanapun setakat ini SPRM masih belum membuka sebarang kertas siasatan.

"Jika nampak isu integriti atau tata kelola siasatan segera akan dilakukan,

Isnin nanti kami kemas kini sama ada buka apa jenis siasatan sama ada jenayah atau tata kelola.

"Kalau berlaku dua-dua, bahagian siasatan akan dilakukan serentak dengan tata kelola," katanya dalam sidang akhbar pada Khamis.

Sebelum ini, DBKL melancarkan siasatan dalam-an berhubung dakwaan tersebut.

Dakwaan salah laku membabitkan ahli lembaga penasihat itu mula tular di media sosial, sejak Jumaat minggu lalu.

Ia membabitkan pelanggaran proses tadbir urus berkaitan perolehan projek kerja penerbitan bahan kreatif untuk DBKL bernilai RM4 juta, yang didakwa tidak diberikan melalui tender terbuka.

Bagaimanapun, dalam kenyataan susulan di media sosial, Datuk Afdlin Shauki menafikan dakwaan tersebut dan yakin isu berkenaan sengaja di-

mainkan untuk memburukkan nama dan imejnya.

Jelas beliau, tuduhan terhadapnya adalah cubaan pihak tidak bertanggungjawab itu juga bermotifkan cemburu dan dendam.

Mengulas lanjut mengenai perkara tersebut, Azam berkata, siasatan perlu dilakukan kerana di-khuatiri mungkin timbul penganiayaan terhadap

individu tertentu.

"Ini kerana, bukan semua yang datang daripada maklumat awam sama ada keluar dari media sosial akan terus diambil tindakan. Sebab itu kita biarkan dulu DBKL buat siasatan dalaman.

"Ketua unit integriti memang ditempatkan di sana, pegawai saya juga terlibat dengan siasatan itu.

"Berdasarkan kerjasama yang baik daripada Datuk Bandar Kuala Lumpur, Datuk Seri Maimunah Mohd Shari, mereka membekalkan dokumen kepada kami antaranya minit mesyuarat dan lain-lain," jelasnya.

Lima termasuk 3 penjawat awam disyaki terima rasuah direman

Kuala Lumpur: Suruhanjaya Pencegahan Rasuah Malaysia (SPRM) menahan reman lima individu, termasuk tiga penjawat awam disyaki memberi dan menerima rasuah bagi mendapatkan kawasan pembalakan di dua negeri sekitar pantai timur dan selatan tanah air.

Perintah reman selama tujuh hari bermula kelmarin sehingga 11 Februari ini terhadap lima suspek yang terdiri daripada empat lelaki dan seorang wanita dikeluarkan Majistret, Mohamad Ridhwan Syarizal selepas permo-

honan dibuat SPRM di Mahkamah Majistret Johor Bahru, pagi kelmarin.

Menurut sumber, semua suspek berusia antara 30 hingga 50-an itu ditahan kira-kira antara jam 12 tengah hari hingga 5 petang Selasa di beberapa lokasi membabitkan negeri di pantai timur dan di selatan tanah air melalui satu operasi khas yang dijalankan oleh SPRM.

"Siasatan awal mendapati perbuatan berkenaan dilakukan pada 2016 sehingga kini dan semua suspek disyaki menerima

rasuah kira-kira RM1 juta bagi kerja pembalakan.

"Selain itu, SPRM turut menyita dua kenderaan mewah dan wang tunai puluhan ribu ringgit," katanya.

Sementara itu, Ketua Pesuruhjaya SPRM, Tan Sri Azam Baki ketika dihubungi mengesahkan penahanan berkenaan dan berkata, kes disiasat di bawah Seksyen 17(a) Akta SPRM 2009.

Semua sekolah laksana satu sesi menjelang 2030

Kerajaan perlu tingkatkan infrastruktur, perjawatan untuk capai matlamat

Kluang: Semua lebih 10,000 sekolah di negara ini akan melaksanakan persekolahan satu sesi menjelang 2030.

Pada masa ini, Kementerian Pendidikan sedang melengkapkan lebih 1,000 sekolah lagi di seluruh negara bagi pembelajaran satu sesi menjelang 2030.

Menteri Pendidikan, Fadhlina Sidek, berkata sehingga ini, lebih 9,000 daripada lebih 10,000 sekolah di seluruh negara sudah melaksanakan sistem satu sesi, manakala selebihnya belum berbuat demikian berikutan kepadatan murid.

Katanya, kerajaan perlu meningkatkan infrastruktur, perjawatan dan pengurusan lain bagi memenuhi maksud berkenaan.

"Ya, ini sebenarnya perkembangan pendidikan yang sangat baik. Kita ada kurang lebih 10,000 sekolah dan 9,000 lebih telah pun mencapai hasrat kita untuk satu sesi dan ada lebih sedikit (baki) yang masih lagi kita perlu uruskan."

"Mengambil kira banyak faktor kerana kekangan soal tempat, premis sekolah itu sendiri dan juga pengurusan lain yang perlu kita ambil perhatian."

"Tetapi memang menjadi hasrat kita untuk sekolah ini menjadi satu sesi sahaja bagi mencapai maksud dan hasrat bahawa sekolah itu adalah sekolah yang kondusif untuk anak di tempat berkenaan, di premis itu," katanya pada sidang media sempena INTAN Minister's Conversation: Pendidikan Menyemai Kepimpinan, Membentuk Generasi Masa Hadapan di Dewan Jemerlang, Institut Tadbiran Awam Negara (INTAN) Kampus Wilayah Selatan, di sini, semalam.

Media sebelum ini melaporkan hampir 9,000 sekolah di seluruh negara mula menggunakan sistem satu sesi bagi meringankan beban guru.

Mengulas mengenai hukuman rotan kepada pelajar yang melakukan kesalahan di sekolah, Fadhlina berkata, itu adalah kuasa guru besar atau pengetua serta guru disiplin sahaja dan sudah ada garis panduan berhubung perkara itu.

Proaktif atasi isu vape

Mengenai kebimbangan ketagihan rokok elektronik atau vape dalam kalangan pelajar, Fadhlina berkata pihaknya memandang serius isu berkenaan dan tidak berkompromi dengan melaksanakan langkah proaktif bagi mengesok gejala berkenaan yang dilaporkan menjejaskan lebih 20,000 pelajar sekolah di seluruh negara.

"Jadi sebab itu pendekatan kita selain memberikan kesedaran dan juga berkaitan dengan tindakan disiplin, kita juga mengambil langkah proaktif bagi mengesok gejala vape ini daripada terus berleluasa dalam kalangan anak kita."

"Kita akan terus berusaha dari semasa ke semasa untuk memastikan ia dapat benar-benar dikekang khususnya membabitkan kesihatan, disiplin anak kita di sekolah dan yang paling utama bagaimana anak kita ini mesti dapat kesedaran penuh mengenai bahayanya vape ini," katanya.

Dalam pada itu, program semalam bertujuan memberi pendidikan kepada penjawat awam mengenai kepimpinan inklusif dalam menangani cabaran pembangunan sosial, ekonomi dan politik.

Tiada trend peningkatan kes influenza

Putrajaya: Malaysia tidak menunjukkan trend peningkatan kes influenza dan tidak merekodkan sebarang selesema burung dalam kalangan manusia, demikian menurut Kementerian Kesihatan (KKM).

Berdasarkan pemantauan KKM, kadar rundingan penyakit seperti influenza (ILI) di klinik kesihatan pada Minggu Epidemiologi (ME) 4/2025 ialah 4.67 peratus, menurun sebanyak 0.14 peratus berbanding 5.81 peratus pada ME 3/2025.

"Pada tempoh sama, kadar termasuk kes jangkitan pernafasan akut teruk atau di hospital ialah 7.26 peratus, iaitu menu-

run 0.16 peratus, berbanding 7.52 peratus pada ME 03/2025," menurut kenyataan semalam.

Merujuk laporan media luar negara yang melaporkan peningkatan kes influenza secara mendadak, KKM memaklumkan berdasarkan laporan Pertubuhan Kesihatan Sedunia (WHO) bagi Rantau Pasifik Barat, kadar positif bagi sampel influenza yang diuji ialah 26.19 peratus pada ME 1/2025 dan 21.97 peratus pada ME 4/2025, iaitu penurunan sebanyak empat peratus.

KKM memaklumkan berdasarkan laporan mingguan WHO pada 31 Januari lalu, tiada kes selesema burung baharu dalam

kalangan manusia termasuk di Jepun, manakala kes terakhir yang direkodkan di rantau ini ialah pada 1 Jan lepas.

Justeru, KKM dengan kerjasama Jabatan Perkhidmatan Veterinar, Kementerian Pertanian dan Keterjaminan Makanan sentiasa menjalankan pemantauan aktif dan pengawasan terhadap ladang ternakan, populasi burung liar serta pasar bagi mengelak sebarang risiko jangkitan.

"Hal ini bagi memastikan Malaysia kekal bebas selesema burung dengan kawalan biosekuriti dan langkah pencegahan yang ketat," menurut KKM.

KKM turut menasihati orang

ramai mengamalkan langkah pencegahan seperti kerap mencuci tangan dengan air dan sabun atau menggunakan pensanitasi tangan, amalan adab batuk yang baik dengan menutup mulut dan hidung ketika batuk atau bersin, memakai pelitup muka terutama bagi individu berisiko tinggi serta mendapatkan pelalian influenza secara tahunan.

Orang ramai juga dinasihatkan segera mendapatkan pemeriksaan dan rawatan di fasiliti kesihatan kerajaan ataupun swasta sekiranya mengalami gejala seperti demam, batuk dan selesema yang berpanjangan.

MACC examining City Hall documents

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PUTRAJAYA: Corruption investigators are combing through Kuala Lumpur City Hall documents in their probe into an RM4 million project.

Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission Chief Commissioner Tan Sri Azam Baki said City Hall granted his officers access to the documents, including minutes of meetings.

"Our investigators ... are combing through the documents, looking for issues involving offences under the MACC Act," he said at the MACC headquarters here yesterday.

Azam said MACC officers in City Hall's integrity unit were also part of the internal investigation into the awarding of the contract.

"I want to clarify that City Hall took internal action based on information it received from social media. For everyone's information, in cases like this, MACC does not act based on information alone," he said, adding that the commission had yet to open an investigation paper as it did not have the full picture.

Azam said not all cases could be pursued based on information

from social or mainstream media.

"Immediate action without proper verification could lead to assumptions or even victimisation of individuals," he said adding that City Hall should complete its internal investigation first.

Asked if Datuk Afdlin Shauki, the City Hall advisory board member linked to the alleged scandal, would be called in for questioning, Azam said there were no plans to call up witnesses.

"Let us first analyse the doc-

uments to see if there was any wrongdoing. I assure you that if any corruption-related offences are identified, an investigation will be launched as soon as possible," he said.

When met after the launch of the Federal Territories Carnival and Putrajaya Open Day 2025, Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Federal Territories) Dr Zaliha Mustafa said she would leave it to the authorities to investigate the allegations.

"We will let the investigation proceed, and I do not wish to comment further," she said.

MACC OFFICERS TO HEAD INTEGRITY UNITS

Anti-graft groups
laud move as a
boost to civil service
governance

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THE Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission will assign its officers to head integrity units in all ministries, a move lauded by anti-graft watchdog groups.

MACC Chief Commissioner Tan Sri Azam Baki yesterday said that a recent governance committee meeting chaired by Chief Secretary to the Government Tan Sri Shamsul Azri Abu Bakar had agreed to the proposal.

The initiative would be imple-

mented in stages soon, he said at MACC headquarters here.

"This (move) is to address the difficulties ministries face in handling governance issues when their (integrity) unit heads are not MACC officers.

"The MACC officers to be assigned to ministries are recognised integrity officers and hold all the relevant certifications."

Malaysian Corruption Watch president Jais Abdul Karim said the move could strengthen integrity in the public service.

"The placement of MACC officers as heads of the integrity unit demonstrates the government's commitment to more stringent monitoring in every ministry for integrity issues and misconduct."

Jais said thought the move was a good first step, it should not be seen as the sole solution as corruption was linked to system weaknesses, work culture and transparency in governance.

"Therefore, in addition to placing MACC officers, ministries need to strengthen internal monitoring systems, implement transparency policies in procurement and services, and ensure stern action is taken against wrongdoers without favouritism," he said when contacted.

Jais said the presence of MACC officers could discourage misconduct but the success of this mechanism depended on how much support the MACC officers were given to act without interference.

"If the MACC officers only serve as advisers without clear authority, their impact may not be significant."

"Overall, MCW views this move as a positive development, but it must be accompanied by continuous efforts to strengthen the integrity within the public service, including by encouraging a whistleblowing culture, administrative reforms and stricter en-

forcement."

Centre to Combat Corruption and Cronyism chief executive officer Pushpan Murugiah said the move could address governance issues in the civil service.

However, he said it remained to be seen whether this new system would supersede existing integrity units set up under the Public Service Department's Human Resources Service Circular SP.1.2.1.

Pushpan also said the move did not eliminate the need for reforms in the public service and MACC.

He said the prime minister should not be involved in appointing the MACC chief and an ombudsman office was needed to independently investigate public complaints.

Azam said 62 local authorities had established integrity units and another 84 had appointed integrity liaison officers. **Additional reporting by Nor Ain Mohamed Radhi**

E-SELF AUDIT

AUDIT FOR 2,000 GOVT FIRMS

AI-based system will cover GLCs and CLBGs, says Anwar

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SOME 2,000 government companies will be audited more efficiently through the e-SelfAudit system developed by the National Audit Department starting this year.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim said the audit, using an artificial intelligence-based system, would cover government-linked companies, government-linked investment companies and companies limited by guarantee (CLBGs).

He said the pilot audit for government companies using the e-SelfAudit system began in November last year.

"More importantly, this system has been developed internally through the department's digitalisation project without additional costs.

"The government, on May 20 last year, issued a directive for the 'National Governance Enhancement Movement on the Governance of GLCs and CLBGs'.

"The directive guides regulatory ministries in implementing regulations and procedures for managing GLCs and CLBGs under the federal government."

Anwar said this at the launch of Phase 2 of the GLC audit.

He said the move followed several issues identified in the companies, including weaknesses in monitoring presentations and reports on meeting Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the

companies' strategic plans.

Other issues included the failure of the chief executive officer to supervise and oversee business operations to achieve the parent company's goals, including those of its subsidiaries, and consecutive losses at the parent or subsidiary level.

"Companies' profits that are not returned to the government are also a major issue, along with shortcomings in the investment and audit committees in providing views and advice to the board of directors," said Anwar, who is also finance minister.

Meanwhile, important decisions made by companies, such as salary payments and service

matters, were also not submitted to the board of directors for approval, he said.

Anwar reminded government companies to always uphold values and good governance.

"Don't take this lightly, especially given geopolitical uncertainties amid a decline in values.

"What is the meaning of faith if this matter (governance) is neglected?"

He reiterated his support for the department, as well as for enforcement agencies, including the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Agency and the Inland Revenue Board, in addressing leakages and improving governance.

Meanwhile, Auditor General

Datuk Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi said the department has introduced four guidelines following the amendments to the Audit Act 1957.

They are guidelines for the Audit of Management on Government Companies, Follow-up Audit guidelines, Follow the Public Money Audit and guidelines from the auditor general certificate regarding financial statements.

Wan Suraya said the amendments to the act, passed last year, was a "game-changer" for the department in enabling a more comprehensive oversight of public spending and enhance governance in the country.

Cuepacs: 6 months for rotation exercise reasonable

KUALA LUMPUR: The six-month timeframe to complete the rotation exercise for government counter staff positions is reasonable.

However, Congress of Unions of Employees in the Public and Civil Services (Cuepacs) president Datuk Dr Adnan Mat said it must be implemented in an orderly manner, taking into account factors such as workload, the level of expertise and the need for adequate training.

"This period can help enhance the skills and experience of counter staff in various aspects of service, thereby benefiting the public service as a whole," he said in a statement.

Adnan said Cuepacs believed that well-planned work rotations could positively impact the well-being of counter staff by reducing the risk of fatigue caused by repetitive tasks.

"However, this approach must be balanced with a robust sup-

port system, including flexible work schedules and continuous training opportunities, to help counter staff adapt to workplace changes without undue stress," he added.

Adnan said each ministry and department had different needs and operational structures, and as such, implementing the rotation must consider factors such as staff numbers, technological readiness and the specific needs of each counter service.

"Cuepacs believes a more flexible approach should be considered, where the work cycle period is determined based on the workload and capacity of each department to ensure that services are not disrupted," he said.

Adnan said Cuepacs was ready to collaborate with the government to ensure the successful implementation of the job rotation exercise for the benefit of all parties.

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
