Rebuilt food court opens in Seri Kembangan

THE reconstructed food court at Taman Tasik Sri Serdang, Seri Kembangan, was unveiled during the first Subang Jaya Car-Free Day for the year.

Organised by the Subang Jaya City Council (MBSJ), the event marked the first such event to be held at the Seri Serdang state constituency.

"The project to demolish and rebuild the MBSJ food court at Taman Tasik Sri Serdang began on Sept 11, 2023, and was fully completed on Feb 4.

"It was built at a cost of RM1.275mil," said the city council's Corporate and Strategic Management Department in a statement.

"The food court is equipped with 10 stalls and public facilities, including toilets for men, women and the disabled, surau, parking bays and a waste disposal facility."

The department added that the project aimed to provide a comfortable, clean and safe space for people to eat as well as function as a platform for traders to earn an income.

Held in collaboration with Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM), the event was attended by some 1,000 participants.

"Both parties worked on a joint mural art project at Taman Tasik Sri Serdang to enhance and beautify the park's surroundings," the department said.

Also present were Subang Jaya mayor Datuk Amirul Azizan Abd Rahim, Subang Jaya deputy mayor Mohd Zulkurnain Che Ali, Seri Serdang assemblyman Abbas Salimmi Che Adzmi@Azmi and UPM vice-chancellor Prof Datuk Dr Ahmad Farhan Sadullah.

The activities included a 5.6km fun run and 15km fun ride, traditional folk sports, demonstrations by the police and Fire and Rescue Department, free health screenings, e-waste collection booth as well as exhibitions on crime and dengue prevention.

The subsequent dates and venues for the car-free day are May 11 at South City Plaza, Seri Kembangan, Aug 10 at Giant Bandar Kinrara, Kinrara and Oct 26 at MBSJ headquarters in Subang Jaya.

Land attractions in demand

Great potential to tap in tourism for VSY 2025 with cruise passengers disembarking at Port Klang for shore excursions

SHORE excursion packages for passengers of ships docking at the Port Klang Cruise Terminal (PKCT) at Westport can be huge income generators for the Selangor tourism industry.

Recognising this potential and in line with Visit Selangor Year (VSY) 2025, Tourism Selangor is placing greater emphasis on providing a variety of tourism options for passengers coming ashore at PKCT.

Among them are private shore excursions, day-trips and tours, said Selangor local government and tourism committee chairman Datuk Ng Suee Lim.

"Most of the time, the cruise travellers have about six to eight hours on land.

"Many choose culturally immersive excursions, seeing colonial buildings or enjoying local food with a family in a village, rather than going to a shopping mall," he said.

Ng said there was also growing demand for eco-friendly as well as personalised tours such as white-water rafting.

For eco-tourism, he said there was Mangrove Point, a park amid the lush setting of mangrove trees within a coastal forest in Port Klang.

"Given the few hours that

cruise passengers have on land, Mangrove Point is ideal and they could enjoy the local sea food," he added.

Ng said this trend of shore excursions augured well for the cruise market.

"Selangor has much to offer and the activities here are a key

selling point. Tourism Selangor has placed a counter at PKCT to promote the shore excursions.

"It is a major earner of foreign exchange, drives job creation and is critical to economic resilience," he said.

He said 39 cruise ships docked at PKCT throughout

2024, bringing in a total of 522,600 passengers.

"With VSY 2025, we are encouraging and supporting those able to attract tourists through the main gateways at airports and the cruise terminal in Selangor."

Tourism Selangor Promosi Sdn Bhd operations manager Arshad Mustapa said shore excursions were important for the enhancement of the overall cruise experience.

"Our entrepreneurs who offer tourists activities must provide packages that would draw tourists. Shore excursions serve as a gateway into Selangor's natural landscape, rich culture and history.

"Excursions offered must mesmerise the tourists and allow them to engage with the spirit of the places they visit and hold good memories."

Arshad said travellers were looking for unique and meaningful experiences that offered deeper understanding of the places they visited.

"Activities such as buying the

Hoho bus to offer unique view of Klang

KLANG'S upcoming Hop-On Hop-Off (Hoho) open-top double decker bus will offer tourists an opportunity to explore the town's rich heritage during Visit Selangor Year (VSY) 2025.

Klang Royal City Council (MBDK) Community Development Department (Cultural and Tourism Unit) director Azhar Samsudin said taking the Hoho ride would be a great way to see and learn about the city.

Klang will be the second after Sepang Municipal Council that debuted its service in June last year.

"Going on the Hoho open-top bus ride will provide a spectacular panoramic view of the city including Jalan Istana where the Istana Alam Shah is situated."

"The street view of Little India, an Indian business enclave, with its huge crowds from the high vantage point of the bus is also

among the highlights of the bus ride," he added.

Along the route, tourist will also see the Sultan Abdul Aziz Royal Gallery, the Gothic-style Our Lady of Lourdes Church and

even pass Gedung Raja Abdullah, which is the oldest building in Klang, built to store tin ore in the 1850s, he said.

Azhar said the 40-seater Hoho bus would be operated by private company, LNH Tour and Transport Sdn Bhd under a six-month trial, starting at the end of next month.

"We are waiting for commercial licensing approval from the Land Public Transport Agency (Apad)," he said, adding that they were still deciding on the ticket pricing.

"Our staff will work with the Port Klang Cruise Terminal (PKCT) at West Port, Port Klang and Tourism Selangor to promote the Hoho bus to cruise travellers," he said.

He added that MBDK's cultural tourism calendar 2025 featured events until Nov 23 to attract tourists to spend time in Klang.

local stingless bee honey, seeing the harvesting of the honey at the farm and tours that focus on local stories and culture are a draw," he added.

Arshad said there was also varied interest among cruise passengers based on age groups.

The younger generation, he said, loved the old and unique cafes for their social media videos while the older generation preferred historical experiences on guided city tours.

"We need more impressive offerings beyond just the standard sightseeing tours," he said.

Arshad added that the cruise sector was expected to be the fastest-growing part of the travel industry over the next three years, representing a major opportunity for travel agents, car rental and tourist guides.

Klang mayor Datuk Abd Hamid Hussain said the Klang Royal City Council (MBDK) was improving the softscape along council roads outside the PKCT.

"With the right combination of large leaves and flowering plants, we plan to create a garden like environment with a tropical feel. Our aim is to create a calm retreat using hardy plants that withstand the sea breeze and heat," he said.

He also said MBDK has drawn

up a tourism calendar for Klang city highlighting the unique aspects of the community and its attractive destination.

"Whether through weekend food festivals or cultural celebrations, these simple events can bring visitors and boost local tourism," he said.

Abd Hamid added that attracting tourists required strategic planning and creative ideas.

"We will explore simple yet effective events that can draw

visitors to Port Klang and boost local tourism and invigorate the economy.

"Tourism is a powerful economic driver for bringing in revenue, giving job opportunities and fostering a sense of local pride," he said.

Abd Hamid added that the city council was committed to welcome all visitors and ensure the arrival of cruise liners brought lasting benefits for Port Klang and Selangor as a whole.

Hunt for future e-sports talents

Selangor launches tourney to boost interest, eyes category at next year's Sukma

SELANGOR government is hoping to unearth talents from an upcoming e-sports tournament to possibly represent the state at next year's Malaysia Games (Sukma).

A total of 64 secondary schools in Selangor will each send teams of seven to participate in Selangor Future Cup 2025, a Mobile Legends: Bang Bang (MLBB) championship.

"This is an initiative to develop the talents and skills of students aged 13 to 17 in competitive e-sports," said Selangor youth, sports and entrepreneurship committee chairman Mohd Najwan Halimi.

"We hope to find potential talents to represent Selangor in the e-sports category in future competitions," he said of the championship taking place on Feb 22 and 23 at Aeon Mall Shah Alam.

He said the winners could even play for Selangor in Sukma 2026, once the state finalised the number of sports for the games this August.

E-sports was a strong contender for inclusion, he said, based on the good reception during Sukma 2024 in Sarawak.

On participation for Selangor Future Cup 2025, Mohd Najwan



said the only criteria were passion and skill in MLBB.

"The students' educational background or identity do not matter; what matters most is their enthusiasm and love for e-sports."

"The list of participants for the championship has been finalised and we look forward to seeing them compete soon."

In addition to prizes worth RM200,000, he said members of the winning team would be offered scholarships worth RM160,000 to study up to diploma level at Todak Academy – a

vocational school specialising in e-sports, animation and video games.

Mohd Najwan hoped the prizes and scholarship offer would empower the winners to also do well in the academic field.

Selangor Future Cup 2025 is organised in collaboration with Selangor Red Giants – Selangor Football Club's e-sports division – and Todak Academy.

The two organisations will also offer guidance to participants in terms of strategising, leadership and teamwork.

Mohd Najwan said Selangor

government was determined to make e-sports become mainstream, starting with the coming championship.

"We see a significant potential in the field of digital entrepreneurship and creative industries," he said.

"Youths deserve opportunities outside of conventional academic achievements."

"I hope this championship will open their parents' minds and perceptions to the possibilities of e-sports and online gaming."

Mohd Najwan added that the championship would be live-

streamed for real-time viewing, in line with settings similar to professional tournaments.

Also present at the press conference were Selangor Sports Council (MSNS) executive director Nizam Marjuki, MSNS deputy chairman Abbas Salimmi Che Adzmi @ Azmi, Selangor Education Department director Dr Jafri Abu, Selangor Red Giants co-founder Simon Lim, Moonton Games marketing and business development head Fikri Rizal Mahrudin and Todak Fusion Sdn Bhd chief executive officer Ikmal Fareeq.

Ambil tindakan tegas terhadap kilang haram

SHAH ALAM - Kerajaan Selangor serta pihak berkuasa perlu mengambil tindakan lebih tegas dan bukan sekadar memberi amaran terhadap kilang tanpa kebenaran susulan penemuan 50 tan peluru di salah sebuah kilang memproses sisa elektronik (e-waste) haram di negeri itu.

Ketua Penerangan Pas Selangor, Zurk Ahmad berkata, sekiranya perkara itu tidak dikawal dengan ketat, dikhuatiri kilang terbabit akan terus beroperasi sehingga memperjudi keselamatan rakyat.

"Nyawa penduduk terancam, alam sekitar tercemar dan keselamatan negeri dipertaruhkan. Penemuan 50 tan peluru oleh kilang haram itu membuktikan betapa seriusnya ancaman yang dibawa oleh operasi kilang tanpa lesen," katanya menerusi hantaran di Facebook pada Ahad.

Zurk turut mempersoalkan sekiranya undang-undang di negara ini terlalu longgar atau terdapat pihak yang 'pejam mata' terhadap aktiviti tersebut.

"Setakat November 2023, terdapat lebih 7,200 kilang tanpa kebenaran di-kesan beroperasi di Selangor dan hanya tujuh peratus yang berjaya diputihkan.

"Isu kilang haram ini memerlukan kerjasama antara kerajaan negeri, pihak berkuasa tempatan, agensi penguatkuasaan dan masyarakat demi masa depan Selangor yang lebih selamat," ujarnya.

Wujudkan jawatankuasa siasatan khas tangani e-waste

SHAH ALAM - Kerajaan digesa mewujudkan satu jawatankuasa siasatan khas bagi menangani isu jenayah membabitkan sisa terjadual atau sampah elektronik (e-waste) yang sehingga kini gagal diselesaikan.

Bekas Ahli Parlimen Klang, Charles Anthony Santiago berkata, penubuhan jawatankuasa itu penting bagi memastikan siasatan menyeluruh dapat dilakukan dalam usaha membanteras kegiatan haram atau campur tangan jahat berkaitan jenayah pemprosesan e-waste.

Beliau berkata, rakyat juga ingin tahu adakah isu ini berkait dengan beberapa badan kerajaan seperti Jabatan Kastam Diraja Malaysia (JKDM), Jabatan Alam Sekitar (JAS), majlis berkenaan dan juga

pihak polis.

"Pihak kerajaan juga mesti membuat satu dasar, adakah Malaysia akan terus ambil sisa-sisa yang tak perlu dari luar negara untuk masuk ke negara kita.

"Saya juga mahu persoalkan, bagaimana bahan e-waste ini boleh lepas melalui kastam? Adakah pemantauan rapi dibuat ataupun mungkin mereka tak tahu apa yang masuk.

"Contohnya jika bahan ini ditolak dari China dan Australia, apakah kaedah untuk mereka bawa ke Malaysia, adakah bahan itu beri kesan kepada alam sekitar,

adakah mereka dapat persetujuan daripada majlis berkenaan, adakah ia dimasukkan ke negara kita secara sah serta sebagainya," katanya kepada *Sinar Harian* pada Isnin.

Dalam pada itu, Charles mempersoalkan dari mana datangnya e-waste atau sisa terjadual dan siapakah yang mendalangi 'perniagaan' ataupun jenayah tersebut.

"Berkenaan sisa ini pula, adakah ia terus dilepaskan ke dalam longkang atau sungai? Atau pun ada pihak ketiga yang menguruskan sisa itu. Semua orang belum tahu sisa ini datang dari mana," ujar-

nya.

Mengulas berkenaan bahan hasilan e-waste atau sisa terjadual, katanya, plastik yang diproses mampu menghasilkan minyak dan kemudian akan dihantar ke negara seperti China serta Australia.

"Isu ini bukan isu baharu, sudah lima tahun dan yang akan jadi mangsa sungai kita, bahan minum, makanan. Jadi kerajaan perlu kawal ini secara rapi, kena ada pemantau yang tegas," ujarnya.

Dia didakwa melibatkan diri secara langsung dengan memberi arahan untuk memindahkan dan menerima wang berjumlah

RM7,200 dan RM5,000, RM6,800, RM494, RM3,400, RM2,450 dan RM2,388 di tiga bank berasingan di Kuala Terengganu pada Ogos hingga November 2022.

Zalina yang diwakili peguam, Mohd Hazwan Hamidun, bagaimanapun mengaku tidak bersalah terhadap semua pertuduhan dan dibenarkan ikat jamin RM30,000.

Dia juga dikenakan syarat tambahan dilarang mengganggu saksi pendakwaan, menyerahkan pasport antarabangsa kepada mahkamah dan melapor diri di pejabat Suruhanjaya Pencegahan Rasuah Malaysia (SPRM) terdekat setiap bulan sehingga kes selesai.

Mahkamah menetapkan 23 Mac depan untuk pengurusan kes dan serahan dokumen. Pendakwaan dikendalikan Timbalan Pendakwa Raya SPRM, Ahmad Feisal Mohd Azmi.

Serbuan PGA temui puluhan guni sisa elektrik dipercayai dibawa masuk dari China

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Kuantan: Sindiket pemprosesan sisa elektronik (e-waste) dan sisa berjadual yang beroperasi secara haram di dua kilang masing-masing di daerah ini dan di Pekan tumpas dalam Op Hazard Sabtu lalu.

Dalam serbuan serentak di Ladang Kelapa Sawit Simpai di Pe-

kan dan kawasan perindustrian Gebeng, di sini, pihak berkuasa merampas pelbagai barang termasuk mesin bernilai RM410 juta.

Diproses dan dijual semula
Briged Tenggara PGA memaklumkan, pihaknya menemukan puluhan guni mengandungi pelbagai e-waste dan sisa berjadual seperti black powder (tembaga/nikel), lebih 670 tan perak yang belum dan sudah diproses.

Turut ditemukan campuran barang terjadual, pelbagai mesin dan jentera memproses bahan pelupusan ditemui dalam kilang yang beroperasi tanpa dokumen sah daripada JAS itu.

Katanya, serbuan Op Hazard itu dilakukan secara bersama oleh Briged Tenggara Pasukan Gerakan Am (PGA) bersama Batalion 7 PGA, Jabatan Alam Se-

kitar (JAS) Kuantan dan Unit Penguatkuasaan Negeri Pahang.

"E-waste dan sisa berjadual ini dipercayai dibawa masuk dari China untuk diproses dan dijual semula ke pasaran luar negara.

"Anggaran nilai rampasan mencecah RM410 juta dan kes disiasat di bawah Akta Kualiti Alam Sekeliling 1974 serta Kanun Tanah Negara," katanya menerusi hantaran Facebook Briged Tenggara PGA Rasmi.

Katanya, pihak berkuasa juga menahan seorang lelaki tempatan serta dua lelaki warga China dan Bangladesh yang menjadi penjaga premis untuk membantu siasatan.

Menurut kenyataan itu, semua barang rampasan diserahkan kepada JAS dan Unit Penguatkuasaan Negeri Pahang untuk tindakan lanjut.

Di Malaysia, ia dikategorikan buangan terjadual dengan kod SWT10 di bawah Jadual Pertama, Peraturan-Peraturan Kualiti Alam Sekeliling (Buangan Terjadual) 2005 Akta Kualiti Alam Sekeliling 1974

Barangan elektrik dan elektronik rosak, tidak berfungsi atau usang seperti telefon bimbit, komputer, televisyen, mesin basuh, peti sejuk dan pendingin hawa.

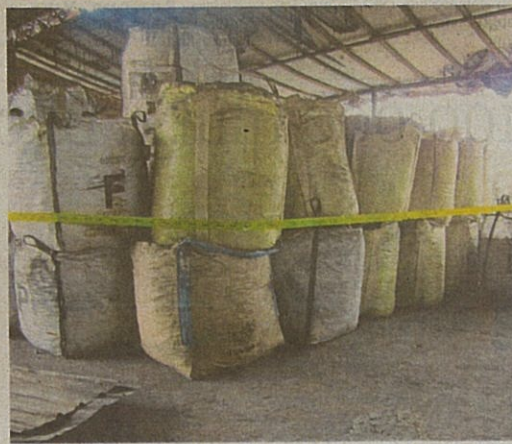

Hanya 1.28 peratus aduan diterima JIPS polis berkaitan rasuah

Ipoh: Hanya 86 atau 1.28 peratus daripada keseluruhan 6,696 aduan diterima Jabatan Integriti dan Pematuhan Standard (JIPS) Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM) tahun lalu berkaitan rasuah.

Pengarah JIPS Bukit Aman, Datuk Seri Azri Ahmad, berkata walaupun bilangannya sangat kecil, iaitu kurang daripada 0.1 peratus berbanding kekuatan semasa anggota kira-kira 125,000, ia tetap memberi kesan kepada imej polis.

Katanya, rasuah adalah satu daripada empat kategori aduan dan maklumat yang dibuat oleh jabatan itu, selain integriti, takelola dan umum.

"Jika dibandingkan dengan kekuatan semasa PDRM, iaitu sekitar 125,000 dalam satu-satu masa, jumlah aduan serta maklumat rasuah adalah sekitar 0.07 peratus.

"Bagaimanapun perlu diingat, isu rasuah memberi kesan mendalam kepada persepsi rasuah dalam PDRM. Justeru, usaha menangani rasuah dan persepsi rasuah ini oleh semua pihak perlu dibuat dengan lebih agresif," katanya pada Majlis Serah Terima Tugas Ketua Polis Perak dan Pe-

ngerusi Persatuan Keluarga Polis (PERKEP) Kontinjen Perak di Mes Pegawai Kanan Polis Kontinjen Perak, di sini, semalam.

Datuk Noor Hisam Nordin menerima jawatan Ketua Polis Perak daripada Deputy Komisioner Zulkafli Sariaat yang memangku jawatan berkenaan sebelum ini.

Azri berkata sepanjang tahun lalu sebanyak 3,603 kertas siasatan tatatertib (KST) dan kertas enkuiri tatatertib (KET) dibuka ke atas warga PDRM manakala 1,404 dikenakan hukuman.

Menurutnya, daripada jumlah itu seramai 164 dibuang kerja manakala diturunkan pangkat (32), turun gaji (15), tangguh pergerakan gaji (16), lucut hak emolument (122), didenda (256) dan diberi amaran (799).

Katanya, selain rasuah, sebanyak 25 kes kematian dalam tahanan polis turut direkodkan iaitu pertambahan tiga kes berbanding tahun sebelumnya.

"Peningkatan tiga kes itu bagaimanapun berbeza daripada trend tahun sebelumnya sejak penubuhan Unit Siasatan Jenayah Kematian Tahanan (USJKT) pada Januari 2022," katanya.

KUALA TERENGGANU: Seorang bekas guru besar di sebuah sekolah rendah di daerah Marang mengaku tidak bersalah atas tujuh pertuduhan mengikut Akta Pencegahan Pengubahan Wang Haram (AMLA) berjumlah lebih RM28,000 di Mahkamah Sesyen di sini, semalam.

Zalina Bidin, 47, membuat pengakuan itu sebaik sahaja pertuduhan dikemukakan terhadapnya di hadapan Hakim Mohd. Azhar Othman.

Dua daripada pertuduhan itu di bawah Seksyen 4(1)(a) Akta Pencegahan Pengubahan Wang Haram, Pencegahan Pembiayaan Keganasan dan Hasil daripada Aktiviti Haram 2001 (AMLATFPUAA) dan lima lagi pertuduhan di bawah Seksyen 4(1)(b) AMLATFPUAA 2001.

Berdasarkan dua pertuduhan di bawah Seksyen 4(1)(a) AMLATFPUAA, guru besar itu didakwa melibatkan diri dalam transaksi hasil daripada aktiviti haram pada 2022 iaitu memberikan arahan untuk memindahkan wang berjumlah RM3,288 dan RM7,200 kepada akaun penerima yang diarahkan.

Lima pertuduhan lain di bawah Seksyen 4(1)(b) AMLATFPUAA pula tertuduh didakwa telah menerima hasil daripada aktiviti haram pada 2022, iaitu wang berjumlah RM18,144.60 yang telah dimasukkan ke dalam akaun bank milik tertuduh.

Tertuduh didakwa melakukan kesalahan itu antara Ogos hingga November 2022 di tiga buah bank berasingan di Kuala

Terengganu.

Jika sabit kesalahan, tertuduh boleh dipenjarakan maksimum 15 tahun dan didenda tidak kurang daripada lima kali ganda jumlah atau nilai hasil daripada aktiviti haram atau RM5 juta, yang mana lebih tinggi seperti yang diperuntukkan di bawah Seksyen 4(1) Akta yang sama.

Pendakwaan dikendalikan Timbalan Pendakwa Raya Suruhanjaya Pencegahan Rasuah Malaysia (SPRM), Ahmad Feisal Mohd. Azmi dan Maziah Mohaide manakala tertuduh diwakili peguam, Mohd Hazwan Hamidun.

Hakim membenarkan tertuduh diikat jamin sebanyak RM30,000 bagi kesemua pertuduhan dengan seorang penjamin dan menetapkan sebutan semula pada 23 Mac ini.

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PETALING JAYA: Ibu bapa perlu memainkan peranan yang lebih aktif dalam membantu anak-anak menguasai kemahiran asas membaca, menulis dan mengira (3M).

Pensyarah Kanan Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Dr. Anuar Ahmad berkata, ibu bapa tidak boleh hanya mengharapkan guru untuk mengajar murid-murid kerana pembelajaran yang berkesan memerlukan kerjasama erat antara rumah dan sekolah.

"Guru di sekolah mempunyai tanggungjawab yang besar menguruskan ramai murid termasuk memastikan aspek pembelajaran berjalan lancar."

"Oleh itu, ibu bapa perlu memberi sokongan tambahan di rumah seperti membaca bersama anak, memantau kerja rumah dan menggunakan bahan pembelajaran yang sesuai," katanya kepada *Utusan Malaysia*.

Sebelum ini, media melaporkan seramai 122,062 murid atau 27.24 peratus dikenal pasti belum menguasai kemahiran asas 3M.

Penemuan itu berdasarkan hasil saringan pengesanan awal literasi dan numerasi terhadap 448,113 murid Tahun Satu yang dilaksanakan Kementerian Pendidikan (KPM) seawal tiga bu-

lan selepas mereka mengikuti pengajaran dan pembelajaran (PdP) sesi akademik 2024/2025.

Dalam pada itu, Pakar Pendidikan, Prof. Madya Dr. Salleh Amat berkata, dalam tempoh enam bulan pertama berada di tahun satu, murid-murid sepatutnya telah menguasai asas membaca dan mengira, termasuk mengenali huruf abjad dan angka asas.

Oleh itu, katanya, penguasaan dalam perkara itu mesti

diselesaikan sebelum ke peringkat menengah,

"Murid-murid juga diandaikan telah mampu membaca serta menulis nama sendiri pada peringkat ini."

"Sekiranya masih ada masalah untuk menguasai 3M, lebih elok sekiranya ibu-bapa berjumpa dengan guru kelas dan berbincang, mungkin ada masalah lain yang melibatkan kesihatan seperti lembam," katanya.

Scam: Hampir RM400 juta transaksi berjaya dihentikan

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KUALA LUMPUR: Institusi perbankan berjaya menggagalkan sindiket penipuan yang cuba memperoleh hampir RM400 juta melalui kegiatan mereka sepanjang tahun lalu.

Timbalan Menteri Kewangan, Lim Hui Ying berkata, transaksi berjumlah RM399 juta itu telah dihentikan oleh institusi perbankan sepanjang tahun lalu sahaja.

Menurut beliau, kes penipuan secara *phishing* dan *malware* yang dilaporkan kepada Bank Negara Malaysia (BNM) turut menunjukkan penurunan sebanyak 60 peratus bagi sembilan bulan pertama tahun lalu.

"Ini menunjukkan peraturan piawaian sedia ada ke atas institusi kewangan termasuk untuk pengesanan penipuan adalah berkesan dalam mengurangkan kes penipuan dan meningkatkan keselamatan perbankan dalam talian," katanya menjawab soalan tambahan Chong Chieng Jen (PH-Stampin) di Dewan Rakyat semalam.

Dalam pada itu, Hui Ying yang juga Ahli Parlimen Tanjong berkata, 95 peratus daripada kes-kes penipuan kewangan di Malaysia terjadi akibat mangsa secara sukarela melakukan dan

meluluskan transaksi pembayaran.

"Memandangkan corak penipuan dengan kebenaran merupakan transaksi tulen, institusi kewangan menghadapi cabaran yang ketara untuk mengenal-

pasti dan menyekat transaksi penipuan tanpa menimbulkan risiko yang mampu menggugat kelancaran fungsi sistem pembayaran.

"Penipu juga sering mengeksploitasi pelanggan yang sah

seperti pelajar untuk membuka akaun keldai yang menjadikan pengesanan akaun tersebut lebih sukar. Corak penggunaan akaun itu seakan dengan akaun yang sah dan tujuan pembukaan juga sah," jelasnya.

UM 19/2 Kuota minyak masak paket subsidi tidak ditambah

KUALA LUMPUR: Kerajaan tiada perancangan menambah kuota minyak masak paket bersubsidi ketika ini iaitu 60,000 tan metrik sebulan.

Timbalan Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN), Fuziah Salleh berkata, jumlah itu mencukupi bagi menampung penggunaan

80 peratus rakyat selain penjaja di negara ini.

"Berdasarkan data Jabatan Perangkaan Malaysia (DOSM) 2022, sebanyak 7.9 juta isi rumah mempunyai keperluan sebanyak 4.8 kilogram (kg) minyak masak sebulan.

"Bagi penggunaan 80 peratus rakyat, ia adalah sebanyak

30,300 tan sebulan dan data DOSM 2023 menunjukkan penggunaan bagi peniaga mikro dan penjaja adalah 21,285 tan.

"Jadi kementerian berpandangan jumlah 60,000 tan adalah mencukupi untuk diagihkan kepada 80 peratus isi rumah dan industri mikro dengan setiap pembelian, kita hadkan sebanyak tiga

paket minyak masak," katanya di Dewan Rakyat, semalam.

Beliau berkata demikian bagi menjawab soalan Cha Kee Chin (PH-Rasah) yang meminta KPDN menyatakan jumlah subsidi yang dibelanjakan untuk Sistem Skim Penstabilan Harga Minyak Masak (ECOSS) sepanjang tahun lalu.

'No criminal element in City Hall case'

KUALA LUMPUR: The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) has found no criminal elements in the alleged misconduct surrounding a RM4 million Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) project linked to actor and director Datuk Afdlin Shauki.

According to Bernama, MACC Chief Commissioner Tan Sri Azam Baki said the conclusion was reached after reviewing documents provided by DBKL on Feb 7 regarding the implementation of its content production and radio studio project.

However, its review identified weaknesses in DBKL's governance guidelines.

"They will need to be addressed," he said yesterday.

He said MACC's Governance Investigation Division was now evaluating DBKL's procurement and payment procedures.
