LAST year, motorcyclists made up 75.3% of road deaths in Malaysia, according to the Malaysia Road Fatalities Index by

Malaysia Road Fatalities Index by Transport Ministry. It was reported that 6,473 people were killed in road accidents, 4,880 of them motorcyclists. From 2010 to 2019, on average, 59% of those who died in road accidents were on motorcycles. Malaysian Institute of Road Safety Research (Miros) directorgeneral Assoc Prof Dr Siti Zaharah Ishak Siti Zaharah said the number of fatalities from road accidents had not dropped.

the number of fatalities from road accidents had not dropped, with an average of 6,300 deaths per year from 2010 to 2023.

"We are recording over 6,000 deaths from road accidents annually, with the exception of 2020 and 2021, which recorded 4,297 and 4,539 road fatalities respectively.

"This drop was due to fewer

"This drop was due to fewer vehicles on the road when the movement control order was implemented during the Covid-10 pandowie "she soid

implemented during the Covid19 pandemic," she said.

In Klang Valley, which encompasses Selangor, Kuala Lumpur and Putrajaya, 1,230 road fatalities were recorded last year.

Selangor had 1,037 road fatalities with Kajang topping the chart at 123 deaths, followed by Shah Alam and Petaling laya. Shah Alam and Petaling Jaya, each with 91.

Kuala Lumpur recorded 186 road fatalities while Putrajaya

had seven. "This data shows that urban areas such as Kuala Lumpur, Petaling Jaya and Kajang tend to have higher fatalities, likely due to higher traffic volume and con-

"In contrast, rural and less densely populated districts like Sabak Bernam recorded fewer

fatalities.
"Districts with higher traffic density also contribute to these numbers, highlighting the need for improved traffic manage-

for improved trains management and road safety in these areas," said Siti Zaharah. Miros also found that 50% of road fatalities occurred on feder-al roads, while 19% were on local streets or municipal roads and

"Police statistics show that between 2019 and 2023, 15% to 22% of fatal motorcycle crashes

occurred on expressways.
"Motorcycles have a signifi-cantly higher incidence of single-vehicle crashes compared to other vehicle types, accounting

Miros' studies also show that loss of control was the primary cause of fatal motorcycle crashes

Siti Zaharah said this was often

Siti Zaharah said this was often a result of high speed, sharp turns or sudden manoeuvres.
Other contributing factors, she said, included rear-end collisions often due to tailgating or sudden stops, besides poor visibility caused by inadequate lighting and slippery road conditions.
"Reckless riding at high speeds

is a significant factor

"Although multiple-vehicle crashes (MVC) are less common than single-vehicle crashes, MVCs involving motorcycles have a higher fatality rate," she added.

Crash trends, rider behaviour

Siti Zaharah said one of the more common scenarios in motorcycle crashes on highways involved collisions with station-

ary vehicles.
"A significant number of motor-

cycle crashes occur when riders collide with vehicles in the emer-

gency lane. "These vehicles can include lorries and cars that have stopped due to mechanical issues

or other reasons.
"The risk is particularly high at night or under low visibility conditions when motorcyclists may not see the vehicles in time."

Miros also found many motorcycle crashes occurring during peak commuting hours when riders are travelling to and from

"These crashes often result from increased traffic density, time pressures and rider fatigue,"

time pressures and rider rangue, she said.

"Vehicles like cars, buses and lorries can create hazardous conditions for motorcyclists, who are more physically vulnerable."

Through various studies conducted over the years, she said Miros identified several types of problems to habition, that igning the properties of the properties of the properties.

'Authorities must get tough on unlicensed riders'

TO IMPROVE safety for motorcyclists, an activist said the gov-ernment should enact a new law prohibiting those without a licence from buying and owning a motorcycle.

Shahrim Tamrin, formerly on the board of directors of Malaysian Institute of Road Safety Research (Miros), said many motorcyclists did not have

"It is common for parents to buy motorcycles for their (unli-censed) teenage children to ride

to school.
"There is a misperception that motorcycles are easy to handle, and many parents find the cost of getting a licence too

high," he said. To address this issue, Shahrim urged the government to expe dite the introduction of the B3 motorcycle licence for those aged 16 to 25.

This licence is meant for those

This licence is meant for thoi intending to use low-powered motorcycles below 70cc.
According to media reports, the proposal was made by the police in 2021 and has been endorsed by Miros.
Another suggestion was for the authorities to enhance cooperation with the Road

cooperation with the Road Safety Council and nongovernmental organisations to enhance awareness about road and traffic safety. Shahrim said the government should rope in experts from the council for Cabinet committees focusing on road and traffic

"A special task force should also be set up to implement the Malaysia Road Safety Plan (PKJRM).

"Emphasis should be given to districts with the highest fatali-

districts with the highest tatalities in road accidents."
PKJRM, among others, outlined objectives to reduce road fatalities by 50% by the end of 2030, he added.
Globally, the number of motorcycles on roads is increasing rapidly worldwide.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) estimates that the number of powered two- and three-wheelers has nearly tripled in the last decade.

This surge has brought significant road safety challenges, particularly in urban areas where interactions between different road users are frequent and complex.

complex. Global Designing Cities Initiative (GDCI) programme mana-ger Jashwanth Tej Kasala said streets must be designed after taking into account all users and their interactions, to prevent crashes and traffic injuries.

stunt riding, commonly known as rempit, and illegal racing are also prevalent causes of crashes

"These activities involve high speeds and dangerous manoeuspeeds and dangerous manoeu-vres, leaving motorcyclists vul-nerable to losing control or col-liding with other vehicles or objects on the highway. "Other reckless riding beha-viours include speeding, which reduces reach severity lane

splitting and filtering.

"Riding without protective gear, ignoring traffic signals and signs, improper overtaking and distractions such as using mobile phones – especially among p-hail-ing riders – also contribute to the risks faced by motorcyclists."

Motorcycle lane ratings

There are three types of motorcycle lanes: exclusive non-exclusive and paved road shoulders.

An exclusive motorcycle lane is built separately from the traffic carriageway and has a physical barrier, while a non-exclusive motorcycle lane is part of the

traffic carriageway and is separated by a non-physical barrier.
Paved shoulders are part of the traffic carriageway marked by a normal-edge line, where motorcyclists can distance themselves

from other vehicles. Within Malaysia, there are 351.1km of exclusive motorcycle lanes and 204.9km of non-exclu-

sive motorcycle lanes. "Our earlier studies have shown a 39% reduction in crashes with the implementation of exclusive motorcycle lanes," said

"However, utilisation rates remain low due to factors such as water ponding, poor pave-ment conditions, roadside haz-



Many riders disregard Kesas Highway rules that prohibit motorcyclists on the main carriageway from 6am to 11pm.

"Other reasons include longer travel distances on the motorcycle lanes, violations by other vehicles using the lanes and inconsistent lane layouts.

"Improvements and mainte-nance, however, such as those on Federal Route 2, have increased usage rates from 81% in 2016 to

usage rates from 81% in 2016 to 92% in 2023."
Motorcyclists are legally required to use motorcycle lanes when available, as mandated by Section 79(2) of the Road Transport Act 1987.
Siti Zaharah said Miros was assessing the safety of exclusive motorcycle lanes and providing

motorcycle lanes and providing them with star ratings. "The rating system will help identify locations with the best conditions for motorcyclists and guide maintenance priorities by highlighting lower-rated lanes that may require urgent upgrades or repairs.

The initiative aims to enhance

motorcyclists, ensuring safer travel routes and encouraging the use of designated lanes. "Highly rated locations can serve as benchmarks when

designing new exclusive motor-cycle lanes, promoting consistent safety standards across the net-work," she said.

Improving bike handling

To promote the safety of motorcyclists, several pro-grammes have been introduced to equip them with road training

Since it was found that most road crashes involved motorcy clists commuting to work, Miros has a Commuting Safety Support Programme (CSSP) that is a direct intervention programme. "It was launched in 2017 in

The Anti-lock Braking System will also be made mandatory for all new motorcycles 150cc and above, beginning Jan 1 next year, which will enhance braking safety and reduce crash risks

Addressing motorised traffic speed, he said, was a major component of this strategy as it was a major risk for all road users, including motorcyclists.

"This can be done by establishing speed limits that are safe and compatible with urban environments.

"For instance, WHO recom-mends 30km/h as the norm for these environments and no more than 50km/h.

than 50km/h.
"Implement physical and operational design measures to reflect that adequate speed.
"This approach will help determotorists from exceeding the designated speed limit and encourage safe speeds, potentially reducing the page of the reference of the speed of the safe speeds. ly reducing the need for enforcement," he said.

GDCI comprises designers, planners and urban strategists

committed to reimagining streets as places for people, shaping cit-ies that are safe, healthy, accessi-ble and equitable for everyone. According to GDCI, studies

specifically in urban streets show that speed reduction effectively reduces crashes and injuries for all users, including motorcyclists.

At safer speeds, car drivers and motorcyclists have enhanced visibility and benefit from increased predictability, helping them safely interact with pedestrians, cyclists and other motorised vehicles as well as obstacles on the streets. "On the other hand, the effect

"On the other hand, the effect of motorcycle lanes in this context still lacks global and recent

Some recent experiences, such as the motorcycle lanes

implemented in Sao Paulo, Brazil, around 2010, indicate that injurious crashes nearly tripled in the following year, which led to their reversion a few years after implementation," he said.

Jashwanth said to curb fatali-ties and injuries involving motorcyclists, governments must also promote a shift towards sus-

tainable transportation.

"The government should allocate street space to dedicated public transportation facilities, making these alternatives more convenient and attractive to

users, besides providing commuters with safer options.
"This includes bus rapid transit, protected cycling infrastructure and safe walking infrastructure to transit nodes like bus stops and rail stations." — By JAROD LIM

Selangor mulls more 'no plastic bag' days

SHAH ALAM: The Selangor government plans to roll out a ban on the use of plastic bags from Friday to Sunday at any business premises in the state next year, says an executive councillor.

Public health and environment executive council member Jamaliah Jamaluddin said the state government is examining the proper regulations to enforce the initiative to reduce the use of plastic bags.

"We have held a workshop to discuss strengthening the relevant laws and enforcement action.

"At this time, it is important for us to know what form of authority can be used under the state government's jurisdiction when this initiative is announced.

"It can be implemented in line with

enforcement actions," she told the state assembly here yesterday, reported Bernama.

An app for any medical emergency

With a tap, MyresQ can quickly have life-saving help on its way

PETALING JAYA: When rescuing someone in cardiac arrest, every second counts towards saving their life.

their life.
With that in mind, the MyresQ medical app was created to quickly alert nearby rescuers to hasten emergency response times.
The app provides the public with the last-mile emergency response, which is a vital link in the chain of survival.
Launched in March, the first-of-its-kind app has already been activated in 459 emergency cases nationwide, of which 127 or nearly 28% were related to sudden nationwide, of which 127 or near-ly 28% were related to sudden cardiac arrest. The others were medical emergencies such as fainting and chest pain.

It also has one of the most com-prehensive databases for auto-mated external defibrillators (AEDs), with 360 registered under the arm

the app.
MyresO helps connect to 5,805 qualified and certified rescuers while giving the precise location of the emergency after activa-

Its co-founder Dr Mohd Afiq Mohd Nor said the idea for the app came in late 2022 after a person collapsed and nobody around could perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

Dr Afiq is an emergency physi-

cian consultant currently working in Universiti Malaya Medical Centre's emergency medicine department, which is one of MyresQ's partners. Following the incident, he said

his colleagues and a few others thought about developing an app to activate responders.

"There was no system to acti-

vate responders to help people in

need while waiting for an ambu-

need while waiting for an ambulance to arrive.
"It took us about three months to develop the app and we ran tests in 2023 to fine-tune it.
"We have yet to see the next part following the hospitalisation of the patients," he said.
"Our focus is to increase the number of responders, to train and yet people to use the app.

and get people to use the app.

"A key performance index for an ambulance is to reach in 15 minutes after a call is made, but a study has found that it takes about

Dr Afiq.

He said the app team's aim was

to get those who received the noti-fication within a 500m radius to reach the victim in four minutes. Dr Afiq said emergency assis

tance for someone in cardiac arrest should be conducted within four to 10 minutes.

four to 10 minutes.

"This is because when the heart stops and there is no oxygen supply to the brain, it (the brain) will begin suffering damage," he said.
As such, when the heart stops or someone has an attack, CPR

or someone has an attack, CPR and subsequent use of an AED are vital, he reiterated.

Regarding the AED, he said users could upload information of their locations to help people find and access them via the app.

When asked about the importance of having such an app, Dr Afiq said the activation of the system and CPR increased the survival rate.


"Even if you are not a responder, as a bystander you can activate the system, which helps tremendously as it notifies those within 500m.

within 500m.
"Among Malaysians, know-ledge of CPR is taught in schools but there is no practical training for it, thus it becomes difficult for someone to perform it when

someone to perform it when needed.

"With the MyresQ app, one can start the CPR, activate the system and if there is an AED nearby, they can use it as well.

"Once you activate the system, you will be directed to 999 via the phone app call network," he said, adding that the app can function nationwide.

"Most importantly, collaboration the professionals of the professional of the professional

(MRCS). The organisation said having healthcare support applications could enhance accessibility and response during emergencies, potentially saving lives.

"We encourage app developers to prioritise user-friendliness, reliability and accessibility when designing their apps, ensuring they are intuitive for all users, including young children.

"Features such as multilingual

support, offline functionality and integration with local emergency services can significantly enhance the app's effectiveness.

"Most importantly, collaborating with healthcare professionals and organisations like MRCS can ensure the app remains relevant, making it a valuable tool for saving lives and improving community health," MRCS told The Star in response to the development of medical support apps.

MRCS commended the MyresQ developers for their innovative approach to leveraging technology in medical emergencies.

"While the MRCS has not yet

engaged in direct collaboration, we are eager to explore partnerships with MyResQ and other like-minded service providers.

"By working together, we believe we can achieve our shared goal of saving lives and improving public health outcomes through innovative and impactful solutions," it said.

On how apps like MyresQ could play a significant role managing heart issues, MRCS said it provided users with real-time health monitoring, emergency response instructions, and easy access to medical professionals.

"It empowers individuals to

take proactive steps in managing their health condition and enables timely interventions that can prevent complications.

"During emergencies, such apps act as a vital lifeline, guiding users to immediate assistance, connecting them to nearby healthcare providers and even alerting emergency contacts," it added.

Malaysian Medical Association president Datuk Dr Kalwinder Singh Khaira welcomed the MyresQ app initiative which could help save lives.
The app's feature to locate the nearest automated external defi-

brillators (AED) machine for car-diac arrest cases will be particu-larly helpful, as speed is essential when handling cases of cardiac

arrest.
"Perhaps more organisations

"Perhaps more organisations can look at investing in an AED machine and perhaps participate by offering its availability through the app.
"It would be good for the developers of the app to engage with the Health Ministry and various health organisations on ways it can enhance its services through the app, and to expand coverage in the country," said Dr Kalwinder.

WE refer to the report "Many in Selangor agree with Sultan's call for half of local councillors to be professionals" (*The Star*, March 4).

As elected members of our resident's association, we feel that conducting public elections to select local councillors can bring about numerous benefits, including building professionalism in

local governance.

In fact, public elections of local councillors could ensure more transparency and increase cititransparency and increase citi-zen engagement with the govern-ance system. By choosing their own representatives, communi-ties could directly influence local administrative decisions. Local government elections were last held in 1963 under the Local Government Elections Act 1960 (Act 473). Under Section 15

Election of officials could spur professionalism in local councils

of the Local Government Act 1976 (Act 171), the provisions relating to local government elections ceased to have force or

effect.
Currently, many councillors are political appointees or serve as assistants to the elected state assemblypersons. This structure creates a dependence on political loyalty, where councillors are more likely to prioritise the interests of their political party or leaders rather than on the needs of the local community.
This undermines the independence of decision-making, leading to an unhealthy governance structure that lacks checks and balances.
We propose that elections for

local councillors be revived in 2025 under the Madani government. This would make elected councillors directly accountable to the people who vote for them, not to their political leaders or parties, therefore enabling them to make decisions that genuinely reflect the needs and priorities of the community.

participate in the elections.
This diversity ensures that This diversity ensures that future local councils are com-posed of people with varied expertise, experiences, and per-spectives, which leads to more balanced and inclusive deci-

balanced and inclusive decision-making.

Political patronage must be reduced in order to enhance accountability. When councillors are appointed by political parties, there is a high risk of favouritism and nepotism. Elections mitigate this by empowering the public to choose candidates based on their skills, qualifications, vision, and ability to serve the community.

Also, elected councillors will be more prone to engage with their constituents and address their concerns, as they need public support to retain their positions.

Public elections create competition, ensuring that only individuals with strong qualifications, leadership skills, and innovative

urata gaji bulanan dijangka meningkat dengan ketara daripada RM3,529 pada 2024 kepada julat RM3,971 hingga RM4,053 pada 2025, didorong oleh kenaikan gaji minimum kepada RM1,700 serta pelaksanaan Dasar Gaji Progresif (DGP).

Pengerusi The Future Studies Berhad (The Future), Profesor Dr Mohamad Salmi Mohd Sohod berkata, langkah ini direalisasikan melalui penguatkuasaan penuh gaji minimum baharu serta peruntukan RM200 juta dalam Belanjawan 2025 untuk menyokong pelaksanaan DGP.

"Dasar ini menyasarkan peningkatan gaji pekerja dalam sektor rendah dan separuh mahir melalui kaedah progresif, memberi ruang kepada perniagaan menyesuaikan struktur kos sambil meningkatkan pendapatan pekerja secara mampan.

"Selain itu, peningkatan gaji bagi penjawat awam turut memainkan peranan penting dalam meningkatkan purata gaji keseluruhan. Kenalkan ini mencipta kesan domino terhadap struktur gaji sektor swasta, di mana sektor awam sering menjadi penanda aras kepada sektor swasta.

"Situasi ini memacu persaingan untuk menarik dan mengekalkan tenaga

kerja berkualiti di sektor swasta, sekali gus menyumbang kepada peningkatan gaji," katanya kepada *Sinar Premium*.

Tambahnya, kenaikan gaji minimum akan memberi kesan langsung kepada pekerja bergaji rendah, manakala DGP bertujuan menstrukturkan kenaikan gaji secara berperingkat dan menyumbang kesan positif kepada pelbagai lapisan tenaga kerja.

Inisiatif ini juga katanya, meningkatkan pendapatan isi rumah, mengurangkan ketidaksamaan pendapatan dan menyumbang kepada peningkatan permintaan domestik.

KUALA LUMPUR: Kerajaan akan terus memberi tumpuan untuk mempertingkatkan teknologi dalam sektor semikonduktor serta memastikan Malaysia da-pat menghasilkan reka bentuk itar bersepadu (IC), menjalan-kan penyelidikan dan pemban-gunan (R&D) cip kecerdasan buatan (AI), dan membangun-kan aplikasi teknologi.

KUALA LUMPUR: Kerajaan akan membuat cadangan lain sekira-nya tidak dapat mencapai kata putus dalam melaksanakan sistem penggunaan Aliran Bebas Pelbagai Lorong (MLFF).



Law may be amended by mid-2025 for the purpose, says Perkeso deputy CEO

Y the middle of next year, nearly nine million Malaysian workers, could enjoy 24-hour Social Security Organisation (Perkeso) coverage.

so) coverage.

Perkeso's Employment Injury
Scheme currently protects emplyees in the course of their work,
but efforts are underway to expand the coverage to all hours.

"The government wants to
amend the Employees' Social Security Act to provide 24-hour coverage," said deputy Perkeso chief
executive officer of strategy and
corporate Edmund Cheong. corporate Edmund Cheong.

"Right now, many employees come to Perkeso wanting to claim

benefits after getting involved in accidents outside working hours.
"We can't help them because the law doesn't allow it," he told the New Straits Times yesterday. He said it was understandable as few employers have insurance schemes for their workers.
"More than 95 per cent of companies in the country are micro, small and medium enterprises

small and medium enterprises (MSMEs), and they may not be able to afford insurance benefits for their workers."

for their workers."

Cheong said once the law was amended, Perkeso would provide 24-hour coverage for all accidents, regardless if they were work-related or not.
"Perkeso does not want people to fall into poverty as a result of an injury, and this is where the 24-hour coverage will be vital."



The Social Security Organisation's current scheme protects workers only during working hours.

Perkeso, Cheong said, differed from private insurance schemes as its protection schemes not only provided lump-sump pay-ments but they were also de-

ments but they were also de-signed for income replacement. "So, if you lose your leg at work, Perkeso will compensate you for 90 per cent of your average last drawn salary for the rest of your

"Now you only have that coverage if you lose your leg in the course of your work. Once we have 24-hour protection you will always be covered, even if you are injured at home."

injured at home."

The same applies to death benefits, where Perkeso pays a contributor's dependants 90 per cent of the average salary for the rest of their lives and their children until they reach the age of 21.

Round-the-clock protection could be important for those in the private sector as many workers cannot afford to rely on their retirement savings in the event of

retirement savings in the event of an injury or disability outside of

In November last year, the Fi-

nance Ministry revealed that 6.3 million Employees' Provident Fund members under 55 had less than RM10,000 in their ac-

counts.

Cheong said the 24-hour coverage would require workers to make additional monthly contri-

make additional monthly continuitions at a quantum to be fi-nalised by the government. He added that the 24-hour scheme would also cover Malaysians injured on overseas work trips.

"We will be one of the first few countries in the world to offer workers 24-hour protection," he said, adding that New Zealand's workers' safety net was the stan-dard other countries looked at in

implementing similar schemes.
Perkeso has held engagements

with employer and employee groups, and other stakeholders. In the case of gig workers, Cheong said Perkeso's goal was to

cheong said rerices of solar was to eventually extend coverage to them as well.

"The Gig Workers Bill will first need to be passed to facilitate their contributions to Perkeso."

Ensuring workers a safety net upon retirement %

KUALA LUMPUR: The government is committed to ensuring that private sector workers have a safety net upon retirement.

Deputy Human Resources Minister Datuk Seri Abdul Rahman Mohamad said this was necessary as many Social Security Organisation (Perkeso) contributors did not have a safety net once they retired.

Rahman said, however, the ministry's focus now was to amend the Employees' Social Security Act to cover non-employment-related injuries.

"We know that by 2030, there will be a 15 per cent increase in the elderly population, as out-lined in the Human Resources

Policy Framework 2024-2030.

"For those aged 60 and above and still formally employed, they are eligible for protection under the Employment Injury Scheme.
"This means that incidents outside of work will be covered, and this (amending the law) has been agreed by the cabinet," he said in the Dewan Rakyat yesterday.

Rahman was answering a question from Datuk Seri M. Saravanan (BN-Tapah), who asked about the government's efforts to provide a safety net for private-sector workers after retirement.

Rahman said there was no age

Rahman said there was no age limit for insured individuals un-der the Invalidity Scheme (Skim Ilat) to submit claims.



He added that this would provide some flexibility for insured individuals to make claims.

"The age limit for Perkeso ben-

efits, such as the Invalidity Pension and Survivors' Pension (Pencen Penakat) remains at age 60.

"The amendment to raise the

age limit from 55 to 60 was implemented by Perkeso in 2013, in line with the Minimum Retirement Age Act 2012," he said.
